1. Welcome and Introductions

Committee members were given the following: LCAP Notes that outlined the State priorities, Board Goals for 2013-14, and an article from the Department of Finance's Website: *Overview of the Local Control Funding Formula Proposal*.

2. Role of LCAP Committee Members

Ms. Dunn explained that the role of the committee would be to develop goals, gather information, and submit recommendations to the Board.

Committee members participated in a group activity – “what do you know and think about school funding?” Three groups were created: Geographic Feature, Song/Book/Movie, or Animal/Insect. Participants were asked to join the group that best fit their perception of school funding. Group responses included: a watershed, Thousand Lakes Wilderness, or Death Valley; Oliver Twist, a dictionary, or a story with many trials and a happy ending; and

an ant colony, and a dead horse (old) and a thoroughbred (new).

3. Composition of LCAP Committee

Discussion was held regarding the composition of the committee, voting rights, student members, and the number of representatives needed from each site. It was determined that representation was needed for the special education and English Language Learner populations.

4. Overview of New State Funding Model and Local Control Accountability Plan

Jim Burfeind, math teacher at Ishi Hills Middle School, briefly reviewed the areas of priority that must be addressed in the plan. A handout was distributed. He added that the committee will need to set realistic goals, be fiscally responsible, and present meaningful information to the Board.

Ms. Dunn stated that BCOE will provide technical assistance if needed. She added that the California Collaborative for Educational Excellence (CCEE) is available to advise and assist the District in achieving its goals.

Ms. Dunn reviewed the “LCAP Notes” handout.

Discussion was held whether or not students needed to be included on the committee and what their role would be. Patty Garrison, principal at Stanford Avenue School, stated that she would research whether or not students in a K-8 district were required to be on the committee.

5. Needs Assessment: What data do we need to collect to identify our current strengths/weaknesses in each of the state priorities?

Ms. Dunn encouraged members to review the elementary and middle school Academic Program Surveys and talk with their site administrators.

Discussion was held regarding what kind of input was needed from parents and how this information would be obtained. Suggestions included having the site councils or PTAs conduct a survey and additional parental involvement on site councils.

Review the academic program surveys, LCAP Notes, and the information that was distributed today.
