PUBLIC NATURE OF SCHOOL BOARD MEETINGS

The Rochester School Board is a corporate body established for the public good. As such the School Board and its individual members have power only when convened as a body in a properly posted public meeting or, if in non-public session, in accordance with the provisions of RSA 91-A:3.

School Board Action becomes official and binding provided:

- 1. The corporate meeting is open to the public.
- 2. Discretion is exercised no preliminary binding action is taken prior to the meeting.
- 3. Notice of the meeting is given to all the members and twenty-four hour notice is given to the public.
- 4. A quorum is present.
- 5. Action is authorized by statute.
- 6. No improper restraint of constitutional rights occurs.

Board minutes must be available to the public within seventy-two (72) hours except for minutes of non-public sessions which have been sealed in accordance with RSA 91-A:3. Minutes are the official voice of the School Board. This requires that:

- 1. No Board member can speak for the Board except as delegated by official Board action.
- 2. The burden of proof will be on any Board member claiming the right to act on behalf of the Board.
- 3. Oral evidence will not prevail over the written minutes of the School Board.
