

FAMILY ENGAGEMENT PLAN 2016-2017

Bissonnet Elementary School has developed and implemented a family engagement plan to achieve and maintain high levels of family involvement and positive family attitudes toward education. The plan includes the following:

A. To facilitate family-to-family support:

- 1. Establish parent support groups facilitated by a mental health professional
- 2. Provide parent nutrition class
- 3. Provide a series of Healthy Parenting Workshops.

B. To establish a network of community resources:

- 1. Healthy Cooking Class (Houston Food Bank)
- 2. Hot After-school meals (Houston Food Bank)
- 3. Monthly fresh produce distribution (Healthy Cities Grant)
- 4. Backpack Buddy Program (Houston Food Bank)
- 5. Free glasses for qualifying students (Eyeglasses for Kids)
- 6. Continue partnership with the Epiphany Community Health Outreach Services (*ECHOS*). Services provided: health screening, ESL classes, immigration attorney
- 7. Provide a Women's Health Advocacy Program 6-10 week curriculum (Women's Fund)
- 8. Monthly parent meetings (2nd Cup of Coffee) with a variety of topics/speakers:
 - a) Services available through the ECHOS;
 - b) Medical support available in the community United Health Services;
 - c) Establishing home environment to support children as learners;
 - d) Other curriculum topics
- 9. Develop a list of community resources to support families with specific needs

C. To increase family participation in decision making:

- 1. Invite parents to participate on the Shared Decision-Making Committee
- 2. Establish "Coffee with the Principal Meetings" to receive and respond to parent feedback and concerns
- 3. Distribute and analyze Parent Surveys





D. To equip families with tools to enhance and extend learning:

- 1. Parenting Skills Workshops (School staff and outside providers)
- 2. Training on the developmental stages of prekindergarten children
- 3. Parent-Teacher Conferences five times per year or as requested by the parent or teacher.
- 4. LEP Developmental Summer Program expanded to all students (not just the LEP students)
- 5. Pre-K Orientation in August
- 6. Beginning of Year home visits
- 7. Family Curriculum Nights (Includes one night each for Math, Science, Literacy)
- 8. Family Evening Field trips (Children's Museum, Fine Arts Museum)
- 9. Parent/child events (Doughnuts with Dad, Luncheons of Love, Muffins With Mom)

E. To provide ongoing professional development opportunities for educators on culturally responsive, evidence-based strategies that support the education of the child:

- 1. Specific staff training on understanding and implementing Prekindergarten Guidelines
- 2. Expanded training on Frog Street Program
- 3. Specific staff training on administration and tracking student progress
- 4. Staff trained on schoolwide classroom management program (CHAMPS)

F. To evaluate family engagement efforts and use evaluations for continuous improvement:

- 1. Parent Interest Surveys at beginning of the year (Measure requests, concerns)
- 2. Parent Satisfaction Surveys at middle and end of year (perceived program effectiveness)
- 3. Parent Surveys conducted after each Family Engagement Activity
- 4. Request verbal feedback at Coffee with the Principal Meetings
- 5. Share/discuss combined results of each survey with Shared Decision-Making Committee and parent focus group. Plan for improved programs and results
