Dear RSU 1 Families.

My name is Melissa Cole and I am the new Food Services Director for RSU1. For the past nine years I have served as the Head Cook at Fisher Mitchell School, and in the spring transitioned to my new role as Director. I have thoroughly enjoyed feeding your children over the years and now I look forward to watching all of them expand their food horizons as they progress from Pre-K through graduation.

This year Breakfast and Lunch meals remain NO CHARGE for all students. We encourage everyone to take advantage of this opportunity by trying new foods and enjoying old favorites. For those students who would still like to bring a lunch from home, they are more than welcome to pick three items to supplement their home lunch each day, such as a fruit and/or vegetable, a grain, and a milk. We hope these flexibilities within the National School Lunch Program will motivate all students to participate. Students who would like to purchase just milk may do so for 55 cents. Students in Bath Middle School and Morse High School are also able to purchase a la carte items. *Milk and ala carte items may not be charged to a student's lunch account.* Cash and checks are also accepted at the register. Funds may be added to a child's school account using My School Bucks (<a href="https://www.myschoolbucks.com">www.myschoolbucks.com</a>).

Although meals are no charge for all this year, it is very important that every RSU 1 family fills out the Meal Benefit Application. With free meals for all, why is this important? Many of our programs and funding depend directly on how many approved applications we receive. So, the more applications we get back, whether a family qualifies or not, gives us the most accurate count possible and is crucial to the success of many of our academic programs. Students will be bringing home an application in their first day packets, however I have attached one here as well. This year we also have a QR code you may scan with your mobile device - it will take you directly to the application if you would prefer to fill it out online. You will see this code on the attached 'monster' poster and a copy is also included in the packet. This information is completely confidential.

Our kitchen staff work very hard to offer meals that are both delicious and nutritious. We try to balance 'heat and eat' foods such as Chicken Nuggets, Bosco Sticks, and Cheeseburgers with scratch-made items like soups, casseroles, and pasta dishes. I plan to bring back 'Taste Test Day' where each student has the opportunity to have a small sample of an upcoming item we will be serving later in the week. Other times after serving a new item, we have let students vote on whether they liked it or not by dropping a token in a jar. Giving students this responsibility has led to many trying things they may not have in the past, and enjoying foods they originally thought they didn't. We also have "I tried it" stickers for our younger students and they proudly wear those after trying something new.

#### Regional School Unit 1 SY2023 Press Release: Free and Reduced Lunch Applications

School Year 2023 free and reduced-price meal benefit applications are available for families with students enrolled in **Regional School Unit 1** which is participating in the National School Lunch Program (NSLP). Meals will be provided to enrolled students at no charge in Maine public schools participating in the National School Lunch Program due to State of Maine Legislation.

While meals are provided for no charge, it is still important to complete the School Year 2023 free and reduced-price meal benefit application. Students may be eligible for additional benefits, such as the USDA pandemic EBT program.

The following household income guidelines for School Year for 2023 have been provided by the United States Department of Agriculture:

To apply, fill out a Free and Reduced Price Meal Benefit Application and return it your local school district. The information provided on the application is confidential. Applications may be submitted any time during the school year. A complete application is required as a condition of eligibility. A complete application includes: (1) household income from all sources or Food Stamp/TANF case number, (2) names of all household members, and (3) the signature and last four digits of social security number or indication of no social security number of adult household member signing the application. School officials may verify current income at any time during the school year.

Foster children may be eligible regardless of the income of the household with whom they reside.

If a family member becomes unemployed or if family size changes, the family should contact the school to file a new application. Such changes may make the children of the family eligible.

Households will be notified of their children's eligibility status for free or reduced price meals. If any children were not listed on the eligibility notice for families receiving SNAP, TANF or FDPIR, the household should contact the school to have free meal benefits extended to those children.

If any child(ren) was not listed on the eligibility notice, the household should contact their local school district to have free meal benefits extended to that child(ren).

RSU1 determining official will review the application and determine eligibility. If a parent/guardian is dissatisfied with the ruling of the determining official, they may wish to discuss the decision with the hearing official on an informal basis or he/she may make a request either orally or in writing to the school district's hearing official.
