

Virtual Attendance Policy

Bangor Virtual Academy (Formerly CRVA):

Students will be expected to log into the WEN network each day that physical school is in session. Students will be expected to maintain adequate progress. Failure to attend or make reasonable progress according to the pacing guide may result in the course being dropped at which point the student will be required to attend face to face instruction. This will be at the discretion of the building principal. This may also disqualify a student from taking future online coursework. Before any students would be required to attend face to face, a meeting will be conducted with the parents/guardians and student to develop a plan.

Students not attending online may be considered Habitually Truant and would be, therefore, in violation of Wisconsin's Compulsory Attendance Statutes 118.15(1)(a) that require a child attend school regularly until graduation from high school, or until the end of the semester in which he/she turns 18 years of age, or until he/she is excused from attendance by the school board. The student and parent/guardian may be subject to legal sanctions.

Students will be denied enrollment into the academy if they are not making adequate progress towards graduation.

WVS/Edgenuity:

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Virtual School Attendance and Co-Curricular Eligibility:

Students are required to maintain passing grades for each quarter. In the case of semester online classes where the semester grade is the only one reported, students must have 50% of the coursework completed and passing or be aligned with the pacing guide and passing at the quarter to remain eligible. The co-curricular code outlines the actions that will be taken if a student is failing any classes.
