PSATS

The 11th graders who took the PSATs in October should be getting their scores back in the coming days, either through their college board account or in Naviance. Students can get their scores in their college board account as well as access more practice questions.

10th Graders and any 11th grader that did not take the PSAT in October, will have the opportunity to take the exam January 26th. More details to follow.

JANUARY REGENTS EXAMS

New York State has canceled the January regents exams. Students in the following categories will get the Exemption:

- 1. A student who is retaking a course that was previously failed and would have taken the regents in January (Ex. A student who had an incomplete in English 3 last year and is currently passing the course in our extended day program and would have sat for the English Regents in January, would get the exemption)
- 2. Students that transferred in this year, had already passed the required course but were expecting to take the regents in January (Ex. A student that moved here from New Jersey, and had already passed the US History class and was expecting to take the January US regents exam).
- 3. A student that needs to retake a regents exam in order to graduate in January.

BOCES

AM BOCES will be virtual through December 10th due to the need for students and staff needing to quarantine.

PM BOCES is still in session until further notice.

While NRHS is virtual the BOCES bus follows the Bee Line bus route. When NRHS is hybrid the bus will be leaving from the high school. Students are asked to check their email each day for any last minute changes to buses or for any issues regarding BOCES.

AP Exams

Students registered for the AP exams last month through their MYAP college board account. Exam fees can be paid now through March 1, 2021. Families can pay online or via check. College board fees include administrative fees for test administration, however, we lowered the administrative fee to offset the fee for paying online so that the overall cost is the same. Students approved for free/reduced lunch can pay the reduced rate provided by College Board.
