A.M. STUDENT CAR DROP OFF PROCEDURES

<u>DO NOT drop your student off in the bus lane!</u> Buses must be able to pull in to their designated slots. All students dropped off by car must use the circle drive.

- Pull all the way around the circle drive to the sign.
- Your child should be prepared to exit the vehicle upon stopping.
- Do not stop half way around the circle drive as others behind you are prepared to drop off their student and pull away.
- Staff members are on duty to see your children into the building.
- Please remain in your vehicle, and have only your children exit the vehicle. Thank you!

CHARACTER TRAIT "RESPONSIBILITY"

We will be practicing the character trait **RESPONSIBILITY** for the month of August. Children need to learn many things as they grow up. At school we teach them to think, read, write, and solve problems, learn about people, places and nature. Children also need to learn how to act appropriately. How you act can be just as important as what you know. Responsibility involves taking care of oneself, helping others, and doing the jobs we are expected to do. Here are some things you can do to help your children at home.

- Talk about everyday examples of responsibility you see family members or others in the community doing. Keep up with homework, play safely on the playground equipment, or fulfilling an obligation when others are having fun is a sign of responsibility.
- Read "The Book of Virtues, " by William J. Bennett or "Horton Hatches an Egg," by Dr. Seuss. These are great books to help children learn more about responsibility.
