

Hanson Beavers Host Colome Cowboys For Senior Night

The Hanson Beavers hosted the Colome Cowboys on Friday, October 14, for their final regular season football game. The first score of the game was at the 6:31 mark of the first quarter when Brock Tuttle ran in for a touchdown from 13 yards. Hadley Wallace was the next to score at the 2:09 mark when he ran the ball in from 21 yards out. With 1:12 minutes left in the quarter, Hanson quarterback, Jayce Slaba, connected with Ethan Cheeseman on a 41 yard touchdown pass.

Slaba connected with Cheeseman for the conversion. Score at the end of the first was Hanson up 20-0. The Beavers continued to hold the Cowboys out of the endzone in the second quarter. Tuttle scored the first touchdown of the second at the 7:16 mark when he ran in from seven yards out. At 4:06 on the clock, Jayce Slaba scored for the Beavers on a one yard run. The final score of the quarter came when Jackson Jarding ran back a 62 yard punt return. Score at

halftime was Hanson 39, Colome 0. The only score of the third came early in the quarter when Jarding scored on a 20 yard pass from Slaba. The remainder of the quarter was a defensive battle with neither team scoring. Colome was able to score two touchdowns late in the fourth but it was not enough to overcome the Beavers' lead. Final score was Hanson 45, Colome 14. The Beavers had a total of 381 yards which included 198

yards rushing and 183 yards passing. Leading the team offensively was Tuttle with seven carries for 113 yards and two touchdowns. Wallace had 75 yards on four carries, two receptions for 43 yards and one touchdown. Cheeseman had two receptions for 81 yards and one touchdown. Jarding had three carries for seven yards, one reception for 20 yards and one touchdown. Riley Haynes caught one reception for 39 yards. Slaba went six-for-six in passing for 183 yards with two

touchdowns. Defensively, the Beavers were led by Tuttle and Stetson Riggs with eight tackles apiece. Cheeseman recorded seven tackles while Wallace had six. Jarding had one interception in the game while Keenan Waldera recovered one fumble. The Beavers end their regular season with a record of 7-1. Hanson will host the Platte-Geddes Black Panthers in the first round of the football playoffs on Thursday, October 20. Game time is set for 7:00 PM.

On Thursday, October 13, the Hanson cross country team ran at the Region Cross Country Meet in Vermillion in an attempt to make it to the state cross country meet this weekend.

Top 20 finishers in both the girls' and boys' divisions earned the opportunity to continue their season. Two Hanson Beavers secured a spot to run at the state meet, including Taziah Hawkins and Eliza Oltmanns.

In the girls' varsity run, Hawkins placed 15th overall with a time of 20:53.79. Oltmanns crossed the finish line immediately after, earning a 16th place finish and had a split of 20:54.14. Cadence Jarding fell just short of the top 20 and placed 22nd with a time of 21:20.64. Hanson senior, Erin Dewald, wrapped up her cross country career at the meet with a 30th place finish (22:27.15). Finishing after Dewald was Alyssa Moschell in 33rd (22:48.85) and Reese Marek in 35th (22:55.51).

As a team, the Hanson girls finished fifth overall.

In the boys' varsity race, the Beavers had three competitors: Carson Ferry, Will Jarding, and Anthony Geist. The boys did not place as a team, but each competed well. Finishing highest for

The State Cross Country Meet will be held in Huron on Saturday, October 22.
