

Beavers Cruise Past Platte-Geddes, Advance To Quarterfinal Round

The Hanson Beavers hosted the Platte-Geddes Black Panthers in the first round of the State Class 9AA Playoffs on Thursday, October 20.

The first quarter was a battle with neither team scoring until late in the quarter. At the 2:06 mark, Jayce Slaba ran in a touchdown from one yard out. With 34 seconds left in the quarter, Platte-Geddes' Joe Foxley found the endzone on a 22 yard run. Score at the end of the first quarter was tied, 6-6.

At the 6:16 mark of the second quarter, Slaba scored on a one yard touchdown run. Slaba connected with Riley Haynes for the conversion. With 3:35 left in the quarter, Jackson Jarding ran in a touchdown from 30 yards out. Brock Tuttle passed to Riley Haynes for the conversion. With no time remaining on the clock, Hadley Wallace scored on an 11 yard touchdown pass from Slaba. Beavers held the lead at halftime, 28-6.

The Beavers continued their scoring momentum into the third quarter. Ten seconds into the third, Jarding added to the Beavers' lead when he scored on a 55 yard touchdown run. Slaba connected with Ethan Cheeseman for the conversion. Jarding found the endzone again with 4:49 on the clock when he ran in from eight yards out. Third quarter score was Hanson 42, P-G 6.

The Black Panthers scored the remaining points of the game during the fourth quarter. Aiden Bulte scored on a 20 yard pass from Foxley and Foxley scored on a two yard run. Final score was Hanson 42, P-G 18.

The Beavers tallied 379 total yards including 295 yards rushing and 84 yards passing.

Leading the team offensively was Jarding with 16 carries for 207 yards, one reception for 36 yards and three touchdowns. Wallace recorded 52 yards on 12 carries, three receptions for 20 yards and one touchdown. Tuttle had six carries for 25 yards. Slaba marked four carries for 14 yards and two touchdowns. Haynes had two re-

ceptions for 18 yards while Cheeseman had two receptions for 18 yards.

Slaba went eight-for-12 in passing for 88 yards.

Defensively leading the team in tackles was Charlie Prien and Lucas Nicholson with five tackles apiece. Tuttle and Cheeseman added four tackles each.

Cheeseman recorded two interceptions in the game while Prien had one interception.

With the win, the Beavers (8-1) advance to the quarterfinal round of the playoffs against the Hamlin Chargers (8-1) on Thursday, October 27, at the Hamlin Football and Track Complex. Game time is set for 7:00 PM.

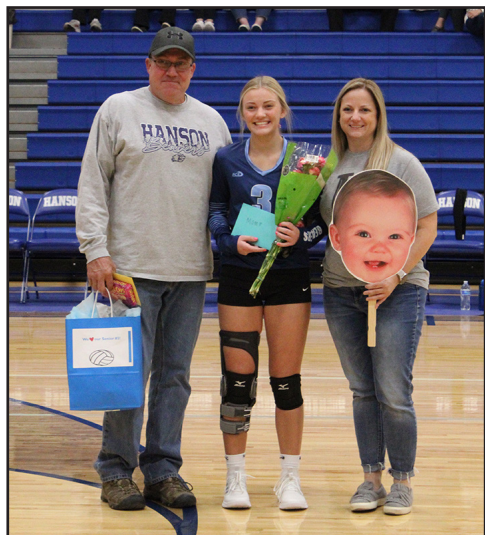

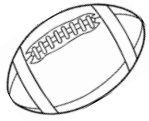
