Beavers Suffer Heartbreaking Loss To Hamlin In Overtime

On Thursday, October 27, the Hanson Beavers traveled to Hayti to take on the Hamlin Chargers in the quarterfinal round of the State 9AA football playoffs.

The first score of the game came at the 10:14 mark of the second quarter when Hanson quarterback, Jayce Slaba, connected with Ethan Cheeseman on a 25 yard pass for a touchdown. With two and a half minutes left in the half, Hamlin’s Tyson Stevenson passed to Evan Stormo for a touchdown. Troy Randall made the extra point kick. Halftime score was Hanson 6, Hamlin 7.

The only score of the third quarter came at the 9:27 mark when Hamlin’s Stormo ran in from two yards out. Randall kicked the extra point. Third quarter score was Hanson 6, Hamlin 14.

In the fourth quarter, Jackson Jarding scored on a 37 yard run at the 8:17 mark. Jarding completed the conversion. With a little over four minutes left in the game, Hamlin’s Stevenson scored on a one yard run. With 51 seconds left in the game, Hanson tied the score when Riley Haynes scored on a 44 yard pass from Slaba. On Hamlin’s next

possession, they were unable to score, sending the game into overtime.

Hanson had the ball first in overtime and were unable to score. When it came to Hamlin’s turn in overtime, Luke Fraser scored on a 10 yard run. With the touchdown, the Hamlin Chargers defeated the Beavers 26-20, ending the Beavers’ season.

The Beavers recorded 401 total yards with 216 yards rushing and 185 yards passing.

Leading the Beavers was Jarding with 24 carries for 168 yards, seven yards receiving and two touchdowns. Haynes had four receptions for 107 yards and one touchdown. Hadley Wallace tallied nine carries for 38

yards and four receptions for 40 yards. Cheeseman marked two receptions for 31 yards and one touchdown. Brock Tuttle added 26 yards on nine carries.

Slaba went 10-for-25 in passing for 161 yards and two touchdowns.

Leading the team defensively was Hayden Schroeder with seven tackles. Tuttle added six tackles while Jarding, Wallace and Charlie Prien recorded five tackles apiece.

Lucas Nicholson and Sutton Dewald had one fumble recovery apiece.

The Beavers end their season with a record of 8-2.
