Amy Foster to Speak to 3rd, 4th, 5th, & 6th Grade Students on April 17 & 18

Amy Foster is a Prevention Educator from the Domestic Violence Coalition. Amy holds a degree in Family Life Education and has talked to over 25,000 students and parents about Bullying, Cyber Bullying and Internet Safety, Healthy Relationships, Dating Violence, Sexual Assault Laws, and other topics for over three years.

Bullying is a constant issue for every school, including Gobles Elementary. Although each classroom teacher talks with students and stresses the importance of positive peer interactions, how to respond when someone is aggressive, mean, and being a bullying, it is a very important issue that requires continual focus. Mrs. Foster's presentation will cover the effects of physical aggression, emotional harassment, social alienation, and cyber bullying. Her presentations engage students with interactive activities that promote empathy that encourages ALL students to take a proactive role for the safe environment of their school.
