

If there is space available when you come in (or call), we will tentatively reserve a space for your child. The registration forms will be given (or mailed) to you.

The completed forms with payment of the registration fee must be received no later than June 30 to secure your space in the B/ASP.

Non-refundable registration fee: \$50.00/family

Tuition is due the 20th of the month IN ADVANCE. (September tuition must be paid by August 20th.) A late payment fee of \$20.00 is charged if the payment is received after the 20th of the month. The tuition fees are the same each month (September thru May) regardless of the number of school days in the month, but only one half month's tuition will be charged in June.

Field Trips:

Field trips enrich and expand the curriculum, strengthen observation skills by immersing children in sensory activities, increase children's knowledge in a particular subject area, and expand their awareness of their own community.

Picture Day:

Preschool Curriculum: The Creative Curriculum is research-based and supports the development of the whole child. High quality, comprehensive resources empower educators to intentionally teach and care for your youngest learners during the most critical and formative years of development.

<u>Responsive</u>: including solutions that address educators challenges and help create a responsive learning environment.

<u>Developmentally Appropriate:</u> promoting learning experiences designed for each age-group and flexibility tailored to each child's needs with high-quality, research based resources.



Kindergarten:

Kindergarten Curriculum: The Kindergarten program strives to create a caring community of learners. Our approved curriculum is aligned with the State of New Jersey's Learning Standards.

<u>English Language Arts</u>: Phonics, reading, and writing are all components of the kindergarten language arts curriculum. These areas are crucial in helping students build critical literacy and communication skills. It all begins with gaining a thorough understanding of each letter of the alphabet. From there, students will be able to put letters together to begin reading and writing.

<u>Mathematics</u>: Eureka Math, a Common Core-aligned curriculum published by the non-profit Great Minds Inc., equates mathematical concepts to stories to develop conceptual understanding. Like Common Core, it encourages students to use various mental strategies to solve problems and focus on the process instead of the answers.

<u>Science</u>: FOSS provides all students with science experiences appropriate to student's cognitive development and prior experiences. It provides a foundation for a more advanced understanding of core science ideas organized in thoughtfully designed learning progressions. It prepares students for life in an increasingly complex scientific and technological world.

<u>Social Studies</u>: The students will engage in an in-depth study of how they live, interact, and participate in their communities. They will discover who they are as individuals and what it means to be members of their family, classroom, and the broader community.

<u>Visual and Performing Arts:</u> All students learn aspects of the visuals and performing arts as part of their Related Art rotation. Their curiosity in music and art begins their journey toward personal realization and well-being.

<u>Physical Education:</u> Students are provided with a learning environment where they develop physical and social skills through inclusive games and activities that emphasize teamwork, cooperation, sportsmanship, and strategic thinking.
