EDUCATIONAL PHILOSOPHY

"All persons involved in the learning process of children have a basic responsibility to fashion opportunities and to create an atmosphere where learning takes place. Nicholas County educators are committed to the belief that each child is entitles to optimum development beginning with early childhood and continuing through middle, adolescent and adult education. A firm foundation in the basic skills progressing from the simple to the more complex insures progress toward maturity and self-development.

The child must be provided a flexible program for creative expression and aesthetic appreciation of man's accomplishments.
