The Stuttgart School District understands the importance of parent and family engagement and the community in promoting student achievement in all areas of a child's education. To foster better understanding and forge positive relationships, the District will strive to develop and maintain the capacity for meaningful and productive parent and community involvement.

## Goal 1: The Stuttgart School District will foster effective parent and family engagement strategies and support partnerships among school, parents, and the community to improve student achievement and to improve reading skills through the following:

- 1. Designate an individual at each building as Parent and Family Engagement Facilitator. Each will serve on a district level Parent and Family Engagement Committee. Those persons are the following: Tia Brickey (673-3563) at Park Avenue, Tawnya Herring (673-3565) at Meekins, Sarah Strabala (673-3562) at SJHS and Carol Jo Lambert (673-3561) at SHS.
- 2. To support the needs of parents and caregivers, Parent and Family Engagement Facilitators will maintain a parent center at each school with information and materials covering a wide variety of parenting topics as suggested by parents/guardians/community members.
- 3. To ensure that information related to school and parent programs is sent to parents, to the extent practical, in a language and form they can understand, an ESL Clerk/Translator, who speaks Spanish, is employed by the district. She assists in translating documents and attends conferences when translation is needed. Additionally, the current foreign language teacher will be asked to serve as an interpreter as the schedule allows.

- 4. Reserve a minimum of 1% of the Title I, Part A allocation for parent and family engagement, with 90% going to Title I, Part A schools annually. Input will be received from the district and building committees on the use of these funds.
- 5. Distribute Student/Parent Handbook containing Parent and Family Engagement Policy and Parent, Teacher, Student Compact. These handbooks are distributed during Open House and Orientation events at each school in August. The compacts are completed during the Open House/Orientation events in August and also during Parent/Teacher Conferences in September. Building administrators oversee this task.
- 6. Utilize a variety of tools to increase stakeholder satisfaction, responsiveness, and involvement in the activities through the use of radio ads and announcements, newspaper ads, newsletters mailed to constituents, the district and school web-sites, public meetings, messenger system, social media and electronic marquee.
- 7. Conduct a Parent Volunteer Survey and provide volunteer training as needed during the fall semester. Parent and Family Engagement Facilitator on each campus is the responsible person. During the February, 2020 Parent/Teacher Conference a survey will be completed with parents. The review of the information gained from both surveys will occur during the spring District Parent and Family engagement Committee meeting which Nikki Hawkins (673-8701) will facilitate. The information gained will be used to help inform decisions for the next year's plan. In the event survey responses indicate a lack of satisfaction with the current plan or services, those responses will be compiled by Nikki Hawkins and forwarded to the Division.
- 8. Hold an annual meeting for disseminating information to the community as well as to gain input to assist in updating the Title I, Part A schools' programs. The facilitator for this meeting will be the building principal or the school's parent and family engagement facilitator. A meeting will be held annually at the district level. Kathy Hopson (673-8701) will be the facilitator of this meeting.
- 9. A district level parent and family engagement plan, formulated by the district committee, will be developed, updated, and disseminated annually by posting on the District's website and by giving copies to families during visits to the various campuses.
- 10.The Stuttgart School District will collaborate on parent and family engagement activities with other programs such as Arkansas River Education Service Cooperative (Cathi Swan 870-534-6129) and Arkansas Better Chance Pre-School (Pam Dean 870-673-3563 Principal at PAE).

## Goal 2: The District will provide coordination, technical assistance, and other support necessary to assist participating schools in planning and implementing effective parental involvement through the following actions:

- Subscribe to and implement an interactive web site providing information for parents on school activities, class assignments, grades and serve as a school to home communication link. Parents and Guardians will be able to access Home Access Center (HAC) and Schoology (NEST) [only used for grades 7 – 12] to view student grades and assignments. It will also provide a means for two-way communication between home and school. Teachers are expected to update these sites at least once per week. A link has been uploaded to the district website by Sharon Mayville allowing parents/guardians access to password protected student information. Building Administrators will monitor this task.
- 2. Conduct a Parent Volunteer Survey and provide volunteer training as needed during the fall semester. Nikki Hawkins will provide this training at the district level or Parent Facilitators will provide the training at the designated campuses.

- 3. Parental Involvement professional development will be provided based on the recommended rotation schedule for teachers and administrators. Kathy Hopson (673-8701) will facilitate this professional development.
- 4. On an ongoing basis, an automated calling system will be utilized by Building Administrators or their Designees to increase school to home communication. On the district level this use of the calling system will be done by the Superintendent or his assigned Designee.
- 5. Provide a copy of the school policy at each school for parents to view as well as provide a copy of each plan posted to the district web site by the District's Executive Administrative Assistant. This document will be housed in the principal's office at each campus.
- 6. The Parent and Family Engagement Facilitators will schedule or assist in scheduling parent meetings and activities at various times to accommodate varying parent schedules and maximize parent opportunities for participation.
- 7. Members of the District Parent and Family Engagement Committee will attend some of the scheduled parental involvement events on the campuses. Reports will be made of their observations from these visits via anecdotal notes given to Nikki Hawkins. These notes will be discussed as the plan is updated and evaluated for the next year.
- 8. Provide to the extent possible, information to parents in a language and form parents can understand. The Director of Educational Student Services (673-8701), Building Administrators and the Building Parent and Family Engagement Facilitators will share the responsibility for the accomplishment of this task.
- 9. The Student/Parent Handbook, which contains the Parent and Family Engagement Policy, will be distributed during Open House and Orientation events at each school in August. The building principals will monitor the adherence to this procedure. (PAE 673-3563, MMS 673-3565, SJHS 673-3562 and SHS 673-32561)
- 10. During the course of the school year, the following videos which may be seen on Arkansas IDEAS will be scheduled for showing: Guiding Children Successfully, Episodes 1 3. The focus of those videos are effective motivation, helping children use their gifts and parents/teachers working together. An additional video is My Child, My Student: parents and Teachers Communicating Reducing Chronic Absenteeism.

#### Goal 3: The District will assist in building capacity for strong parental involvement by:

- 1. Administrators, Counselors and Teachers will provide information to participating parents in such areas as national, state, and local education goals, including parents' rights as defined in Title I, Part A.
- 2. The Principal will assist in the formation of a parent organization such as PTA/ PTO at each building. At Park Avenue, this organization is called C.I.A. (Community in Action).
- 3. The Parent and Family Engagement Facilitator (PAE 673-3563, MMS 673-3565, SJHS 673-3562 and SHS 673-3561) on each campus will conduct a Parent Satisfaction Survey in the spring semester. This survey will be utilized as one element of evaluating the current plan as plans are made for the next year.
- 4. Director of Educational Student Services (673-8701) will maintain a district-wide parent resource center containing a variety of age appropriate materials for parents to help their students with.

- 5. A parent activity will be held regularly at Title I schools, to promote parent participation, when possible, childcare will be provided if needed.
- 6. Through the district's Director of Educational Student Services, Nikki Hawkins (673-8701), reasonable support for parental involvement will be provided to participating Title I, Part A schools.
- 7. Information on state standards and graduation requirements will be shared via information posted to the district and school web pages. This activity will be handled by Hawkins, Brickey, Herring, Strabala and Lambert with the additional input of the building principals.

# Goal 4: The District will conduct, with the involvement of parents, ongoing evaluation of the content and effectiveness of the parent and family engagement policy as it relates to strategies for increasing parental participation and identifying barriers to greater participation by:

- 1. Conducting a Parent Satisfaction Survey and evaluate the results. The survey will be conducted during the second Parent/Teacher Conference held in February, 2020. The Parent and Family Engagement Facilitator on each campus will be responsible for collecting this information. Once collected at the building level, the results will be reviewed and discussed by the district committee during a meeting in the spring semester. Nikki Hawkins (673-8701) will facilitate this meeting and review.
- Developing procedures for collecting parent participation documentation through sign-in lists for workshops, meetings, and conferences; schedules; brochures; meeting notes; and other means as appropriate throughout the school year. Each campus Parent and Family Engagement Facilitator will receive and store this documentation from various faculty and staff members. (PAE 673-3563, MMS 673-3565, SJHS 673-3562 and SHS 673-3561)
- 3. The campus Parent and Family Engagement Facilitator will conduct an annual review of the parental involvement plan with input from parents, teachers and community members. Input from this meeting should also address barriers to increased parental involvement and how these barriers may be successfully reduced. Minutes of this meeting will be taken. Revisions will be made as necessary with the guidance of the school's principal. (PAE 673-3563, MMS 673-3565, SJHS 673-3562 and SHS 673-3561)
- 4. The District Parent and Family Engagement Committee will meet to discuss the results of the annual survey. Parent comments will be included and encouraged by the facilitator, Nikki Hawkins (673-8701), as efforts are made to improve the plan.
- 5. Members of the District Parent and Family Engagement Committee will disseminate results from the survey to faculty, staff, parents and community. Included in this report will be a request for increased parent participation and will be feedback from parents on how they'd like to see funds spent.
- 6. During the district team's annual meeting, facilitated by Nikki Hawkins (673-8701), comments on evaluation forms/anecdotal notes will be discussed. The focus will be to improve the parent and family engagement and increase satisfaction of having attended events at their child's school.
- 7. Reserve a minimum of 1% of the Title I, Part A allocation for parent and family engagement, with 90% going to Title I, Part A schools annually.

### Goal 5: The District will coordinate with other organizations, businesses and community partners to provide additional support and resources to families.

 Parents and community members will be recruited by the building principals and campus Parent and Family Engagement Facilitator to serve on the ACSIP/INDISTAR committee at each school and the district level. The committee will review the Title I plan and will be encouraged to offer suggestions in developing the Title I plan. Parent contacts will be initiated based upon information gained from sign in sheets from school and district activities and upon lists of names submitted by principals. Community member contacts will be begun based on parent suggestions or in response to volunteer requests.

- 2. Parents will be asked to complete an annual survey suggesting ways to improve district effectiveness in terms of parental involvement. The Parent and Family Engagement Facilitator will be responsible for collecting the surveys and distributing the information gained. Tia Brickey 673-3563, Tawnya Herring 673-3565, Sarah Strabala 673-3562 and Carol Jo Lambert 673-3561)
- 3. Each campus will create and maintain a parent resource center as facilitated by the campus P & F E Facilitators.
