Approval of Use of Beginning Fund Balance

Recommendation was made to adopt the Use of Beginning Fund Balance Resolution as presented.

#47-1/17/23 Moved by Mr. Kleve, seconded by Ms. Koch, that the Holyoke School District Re-1J adopt the following resolution:

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE USE OF A PORTION OF BEGINNING FUND BALANCE AS AUTHORIZED BY COLORADO STATUTES

WHEREAS, C.R.S. 22-44-105 states that a budget, duly adopted pursuant to this article, shall not provide for expenditures, interfund transfers, or reserves, in excess of available revenues and beginning fund balance.

WHEREAS, the Board of Education may authorize the use of a portion of the beginning fund balance in the budget, stating the amount to be used, the purpose for which the expenditure is needed, and the district's plan to ensure that the use of the beginning fund balance will not lead to an ongoing deficit.

WHEREAS, the Board of Education has determined the beginning fund balance in all funds are sufficient and will be used to support only non-recurring expenditures and this action will not lead to an ongoing deficit and is the most fiscally responsible approach for the District.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

In accordance with C.R.S. 22-44-105, that the Board of Education authorizes the use of a portion of the FY2022-2023 Beginning Fund Balance from the following funds:

General Fund - \$3,403,379 Food Service Fund - \$290,902 Student Activity Account - \$163,086 Trust Fund - \$29,949 Bond Fund - \$342,661 Building Fund - \$175,109 Capital Reserve - \$402,382

The use of the funds will be used primarily, but not limited to, salaries, benefits, capital projects, infrastructure upgrades, unforeseen large repairs and student activities and needs.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the use of this portion of the beginning fund balance for the purposes set forth above will not lead to an ongoing deficit.
