Please submit letters of concern by Thursday, April 6^{th} , 2023. Please note that letters submitted after this time frame will not be considered within our class placement procedures. Also understand if your child is in 5th or 6th grade your child will rotate between classrooms throughout the day. Thank you for your partnership in the education of your child.
