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## **What is academic and career planning (ACP)?**

Academic and Career Planning, or ACP, is a student-driven, adult-supported process in which students create and cultivate their own unique and information-based visions for postsecondary success, obtained through self-exploration, career exploration, and the development of career management and planning skills.

## **Why are we doing this?**

*PI 26.01 Applicability and purpose.*

(1) Under s. 121.02 (1) (m), Stats., every school board shall provide access to an education for employment program approved by the state superintendent. Under s. 115.28 (59), Stats., the state superintendent shall ensure that every school board is providing academic and career planning services to pupils enrolled in grades 6 to 12 in the school district.

## **Student Demographics**

The school district of Eleva-Strum serves approximately 650 students PK-12. The district currently has two school buildings (PK-3 and 4-12) but is nearing the construction phase of an addition to the MS/HS building. See [plans](#) for more information about the upcoming building addition.

## **How will we implement the necessary changes?**

Our counseling department will work with 6-12 students to accomplish the goals set out by this plan. Other parts of the career plan will be accomplished in the Career and Technical Education courses.

## **What will Career Cruising allow us to do?**

To provide a platform in which the School District of Eleva-Strum can meet the ACP state requirement. This software provides students and educators with a tool to research various careers based on an interest inventory, learning styles, skill assessment, and an ability inventory. This will also allow us to improve the scheduling process at the junior/senior high school. Career Cruising will also allow our students to apply for financial aid, scholarships, and research future educational opportunities.

## **How will this help our students?**

This career software will provide a tool in which students can identify areas of interest, skill levels, as well as research practical information about skills and education required, as well as the cost and timeframe for career opportunities. This software also provides a centralized location for class lists, scheduling, and post high school plans. Additionally, seniors pursuing post-secondary education will be able to apply for financial aid, research college options, and identify the costs associated with each educational program.

## **How will this help our staff?**

The Career Cruising software has created activities to assist teachers with the supplemental delivery of ACP during the advisory period, to assist students in their career planning. Another benefit to the software is the data tracking available to provide insight on desirable future classes based on student interest, demand, and career interests. Moreover, information gathered from the software may also assist with identifying educational weaknesses that may not have been noticed before, through the use of the ability and skill assessment. This will also improve the efficiency of scheduling and setting up students four year plan.

## **How will this integrate with what the students are already doing for future career planning?**

Student will be able to input their four year plan into the software. Students also will be able to upload artifacts into the program about career exploration or major class projects concerning their future.

## **How can families get involved in academic and career planning?**

Parents will be informed of the ACP process via a letter distributed at registration night in start-of-year paperwork to students. Additional updates will be provided in biannual newsletters and social media postings. Parents will be provided with a link to the Career Cruising software in order to facilitate involvement in their students' ACP progress, with guidelines linked on Granton ACP web page, describing how to utilize the software. Parents are also invited to planning conferences with the school counselor, which occur in 8th, 11th, and 12th grades.

- Promote ACP within our district and community.
- Seek out additional community partnerships.
- Create and implement an advisory group that focuses on the continuous improvement of our ACP program.

- Expand our ACP program to be an all-inclusive K-12 program.
- Educate and assist our teachers to increase curriculum connections and opportunities within our academic and career planning systems for each student.

Our Work Based Learning (WBL) programs provide the opportunity for students to gain experience in the workforce while also receiving high school credit. Students who participate in the program earn a Youth Apprenticeship Certificate through the Department of Workforce Development (DWD).

## **Work Experience and Youth Apprenticeship Business Partnerships**

### **General Overview:**

The School District of Eleva-Strum understands business involvement plays a key role in creating a successful school district and Academic and Career Planning program. Having an opportunity for real on-the-job experience can be an excellent opportunity for all students. We are interested in partnering with our local businesses to help provide these real-world experiences.

### **Business Partnership Activities:**

**Classroom Presenters:** Employers (or designated employee) presents in front of a class (at the school) about his/her company, specific career, and/or other employment topics. This presentation could last between 30-50 minutes and be done once or for multiple classes. Presentations could be given for students in grades 6-12 wherever most appropriate.

**Mock Interviews:** Employer (or designated employee) helps with mock interviews at the school on scheduled mock interview days. Mock interviews take place in a variety of classes. Questions and procedure structure will be provided by the class instructor. The time frame for this activity varies from part/all of one day to smaller amounts of time over several days.

**Reality Check:** Employer (or designated employee) volunteers at a table to share with students information about topic related to their specific career area and talk with students. This is an annual half-day for all students in grade 11.

**Job Shadowing Experience:** During a job shadow, a student comes to the place of employment for a half or full day experience to *observe* a “day in the life” of this particular occupation. Students will be responsible for their own transportation to and from the business, lunch (if necessary), and to supply the employer with any permission slips, liability waivers, etc. needed. Job shadows can be done once or several times depending on each individual situation and arrangement. Students in grades 9-12 can participate.

**Youth Apprenticeship:** Youth Apprenticeship (YA) is a WI state (Department of Workforce Development) program designed to give hands on learning experiences along with classroom instruction. Students (only open to grades 11-12) can participate in a one or two year program.
