Protocol for Visitors/Guests:

- All visitors, including parents and siblings, are required to enter through the front door of the building and wait in the enclosed vestibule.
- Visitors should identify themselves and inform office personnel of their reason for being at school.
- If you are dropping off lunches, papers, books, etc., you will leave them on the bench in the vestibule. A staff member will deliver the items to the students. Parents/guests will not be allowed to enter the secured entrance without permission.
- Visitors must sign in, identifying their name, the date and time of arrival, and the classroom or location they are visiting. Approved visitors must wear visitor lanyard identifying themselves as a guest. Visitors are required to proceed immediately to their location in a quiet manner. All visitors must return to the main office and sign out before leaving the school.
- Any person wishing to confer with a staff member should contact that staff member to make an appointment. Conferences with teachers are held, to the extent possible, outside school hours or during the teacher's conference/preparation period.
- Visitors are expected to abide by all school rules during their time on school property. A visitor who fails to conduct himself or herself in a manner that is appropriate will be asked to leave and may be subject to criminal penalties for trespassing and/or disruptive behavior.

Thank you for helping us keep our buildings, staff and students safe and secure.

These protocols/procedures are subject to change at any time the district feels they need to be updated. Our ultimate goal is the safety of our students and staff.

Tips for a Safe Ride

At the Bus Stop:

- Arrive early at the bus stop – at least five minutes before the bus is scheduled to arrive
- Stand 6 feet (or three giant steps) away from the curb while waiting for the bus
- Do not move towards the bus until the door is all the way open
- Check for cars
-

Around the Bus

- Wait for the stop sign and crossing gate to fully open, make eye contact with the driver
- Check that traffic is stopped
- Cross in front of the bus – at least 10 feet (or five giant steps)
- Never walk behind the bus
- If you drop something near the bus, do not pick it up; tell the bus driver instead


Getting On/Off the Bus

- Wait until the bus has stopped and the door opens before approaching the bus or standing up on the bus
- Use the handrail
- Check that you have all your items

Behavior on the Bus:

- Always listen to the driver
- Stay in your seat, no standing or walking in the aisle
- Keep head, arms and all items inside the bus
- Talk quietly, no loud noises
- Turn volume off or wear headphones with phones, iPad, games, etc.
- Keep to yourself, be respectable to others
- No eating on the bus
- Clean up all trash
