Montana Safety Culture Act Evaluation

Enacted in 1993, the Montana Safety Culture Act (MSCA) requires that all employers establish an educational based safety program and a comprehensive safety and health program. A brief review of the inspectors' observations for each employer requirement under the MSCA is listed below:

All Employers

- 1. Provide each new employee with a general safety orientation containing information common to all employees and appropriate to the business operations, before they begin their regular job duties.
 - St. Ignatius High School maintains documentation of new employee safety orientation.
- 2. Provide job or task-specific safety training appropriate for employees before they perform that job or task without direct supervision.
 - Task-specific safety training for mobile equipment and specialized tasks is conducted for affected employees.
- 3. Offer continuing regular refresher safety training.
 - Employees of St. Ignatius Schools are offered regular refresher safety training such as first aid/CPR and bloodborne pathogen training.
- 4. Provide a system for the employer and their employees to develop an awareness and appreciation of safety through tools such as newsletters, periodic safety meetings, posters, and safety incentive programs.
 - Documentation of a system to develop and promote an awareness and appreciation of safety is in place. Employees receive periodic safety newsletters.
- 5. Provide periodic self-inspection for hazard assessment when the safety program is implemented, new worksites are established, and thereafter as is appropriate to the business operations, but at least annually.
 - Self-inspections for safety hazards are conducted for all facilities at least annually.

- 6. Include documentation of performance of activities listed in (1) through (5) above. Keep the documentation for three years.
 - Documentation for the above elements of the MSCA is maintained.

Additional Requirements for Employers with More Than 5 Employees

- 1. Develop and implement policies and procedures that assign specific safety responsibilities and safety performance accountability.
 - St. Ignatius Elementary School has a policy handbook in place that assign specific safety responsibilities and safety performance accountability.
- 2. Develop and implement procedures for reporting, investigating, and taking corrective action on all work-related incidents, accidents, injuries, illnesses and known unsafe work conditions or practices.
 - St. Ignatius Elementary School has a policy handbook in place for reporting, investigating, and taking corrective action on all workrelated incidents, accidents, injuries, illnesses and known unsafe work conditions or practices.
- 3. Have a safety committee in place, which complies with the requirements of the MSCA.
 - St. Ignatius Elementary School has a safety committee in place that meets the requirements of the MSCA

Hazard Description and Correction Recommendations


Serious Violations

Item Number: 1

Standard: ARM 24.30.102: 29 CFR 1910.134(h)(2)(i). All respirators shall be stored to protect them from damage, contamination, dust, sunlight, extreme temperatures, excessive moisture, and damaging chemicals, and they shall be packed or stored to prevent deformation to the facepiece and exhalation valve.

Condition: Observed a half-masked respirator in the Janitors Closet that was not stored properly.

Recommended Action: Store respirators in a sealed bag or container.




Other than Serious Violations

Item Number: 2

Standard: ARM 24.30.102; 29 CFR 1910.305(b)(2)(i). All pull boxes, junction boxes, and fittings shall be provided with covers identified for the purpose. If metal covers are used, they shall be grounded. In completed installations, each outlet box shall have a cover, faceplate, or fixture canopy. Covers of outlet boxes having holes through which flexible cord pendants pass shall be provided with bushings designed for the purpose or shall have smooth, well-rounded surfaces on which the cords may bear.

Condition: Observed a missing faceplate in the Janitor Closet. Also, the cover for the fire alarm was hanging off exposing live wires in the Boiler Room.





Health Evaluation:

As stated above (Item Number 1), a half-mask respirator was observed to be stored incorrectly in the Janitor Closet. Respirators must be stored inside of a sealed bag or container to prevent contaminants from building up inside the mask. This could lead the user to inhale these contaminants once the respirator is donned. Furthermore, a written respiratory protection program must be in place if employees are to wear respirators. The requirements of the program differ slightly depending on if the use of the respirators is mandatory or voluntary.

Mandatory Usage: If the use of the respirators is mandatory then those elements required in 29 CFR 1910.134(c)(1) must be followed. These elements include: Medical evaluations, fit testing, procedures for scheduled cleaning and maintenance, employee training, and procedures for regular program evaluation. All of these elements must be documented.

<u>Voluntary Usage</u>: If the use of the respirators is voluntary then those elements required in 29 CFR 1910.134(c)(2) must be followed. These elements include: Medical evaluations, procedures for scheduled cleaning and maintenance, and employee training. All of these elements must be documented.






