

PROGRAM OUTCOMES

Evans Scholars graduate at a rate of **95%**, significantly higher than national averages for the student populations the Program serves. After graduation, Evans Scholars are well-prepared to build successful careers.

Cumulative GPA of the 1,070 Evans Scholars in school




Percentage of Scholars who are firstgeneration college students

PROGRAM EFFICIENCY

The ESF negotiates favorable tuition rates where possible, bringing the tuition and housing cost per Evans Scholar well below the approximate average cost of full-price tuition. These efforts have earned ESF a **four-star** rating from nonprofit watchdog Charity Navigator.
