Special City Council meeting called on July 20

On Thursday, July 20 the Atkinson City Council called an emergency meeting with only eight topics on the agenda.

The meeting began with the council taking roll call as well as approving the minutes for the July 10 meeting.

The big topic of discussion for the night was the discussion of approving Officer Jimmy Collins as the new Interim Chief of Police at \$35 an hour with no benefits.

This brought up several questions and discussions from the crowd, most curious about what the plan was for when Officer Mincer returned. The final verdict was that Collins would stay as the Interim Chief of Police until Mincer was able to return. Once Mincer was able to return, the position would be open for anyone to apply for, as it is an equal opportunity position. Meaning that for Mincer to get that position, he would have to apply for it.

After a long debate, with members of the community speaking their minds, it was decided that Collins would take over as the Interim Chief of Police for the City of Atkinson, with only one no across the board.

After Mincer gets his final clearance to begin working again, the position of Chief of Police will open up for applicants. Collins made it clear that he was not interested in taking on the position full time. Mincer stated that he was cleared for work on his shoulder and ankle and is now awaiting clearance on his back to return to the City of Atkinson Police Depart-

Following the approval of Officer Collins, the council approved the purchase of a new gun safe for the Police Department, hoping to shop locally for the new item.

The final discussions for the nearly hour-long meeting were the approvals for a building permit for 6 Pack LLC to construct two different wood frames for 108 East South Street and 510 South Williams Street. Both were approved, with the Council wanting a sidewalk installed as well at the property on 510 South Williams Street.

The meeting adjourned shortly after, ending the meeting at around 50



Mellor lives out dream of ballooning at 94

At 94 years old, Jean Mellor always envisioned how fun it would be to ride in a hot air balloon, but never believed she'd get the chance to act upon that

Fortunately for Mellor, an opportunity came knocking on her door on the weekend of Saturday, July 8, during her family reunion. The reunion was held just north of Atkinson, featuring from family across the country. Included in this reunion was Mellor's niece, who just so happens to own a hot air balloon.

Mellor's niece, Nancy Lambertson of Colorado, had impulsively bought her balloon just a few years ago. Seeing it at a convention and following what her gut was telling her.

'She hadn't even gotten her pilots license yet," Mellor said. "Imagine if she wouldn't have

been able to get it. She would've

just been stuck with the bal-

Lambertson was fortunately able to receive her license shortly after her purchase and found her new love in flying. For the past few years, Lambertson had been trying to get the balloon to Nebraska to fly with her family, but weather had prevented that.

That was, until this year, when Lambertson made the trip, with the weather being perfect for flying.

For Mellor, it took little-to-no convincing to get her up in the balloon. "I knew right away I wanted to go up," she stated.

The balloon stood at over 100 feet tall and flew to perfection. While they're unsure of the exact height their balloon was at, the typical hot air balloon flies from anywhere between 1,000 and 3,000 feet off of the ground, high enough to make people look like ants.

The flight lasted around 45 minutes, long enough for Mellor to soak in all the beauties of the farmland around her.

'You know all of those farm

ponds the guy's fish in around here?", Mellor asked. "Well, I

could see all of those ponds!" The balloon flew with no destination in sight. The crew had a chase car following to make sure they didn't get lost, but everything went smoothly, according to Mellor and family.

The ride was described as quiet and peaceful, due to the balloon's engine-less way of flying. With the weather making it a 'bluebird day' for Mellor and family.

After over a half-hour in the sky, the balloon and its three riders landed safely in one of Goeke's fields.

When asked if she would do it again, Mellor's answer was simple. "Definitely," she said, smiling from ear to ear.

Mellor now proudly wears a colorful hot air balloon pin on her left shoulder as a showcase of her willingness to try new

Atkinson-Stuart Food Pantry numbers down

Participants to the Atkinson-Stuart Food Pantry are receiving half the amount of food distributed to them during Covid.

Director of the food pantry, Joyce Huston, said each family is given at least 15 lbs. of food twice a month and once a month receive a 15 lbs produce box. "We try to give a protein each time," she said. Fresh chicken and fish are the meats frequently used for the protien. "We are given canned pork but we don't see much beef unless it is something we are given through an outside source", Huston explained.

While food distribution was increased to once a week then, it is now back to the original distribution days of twice monthly on the first and third Wednesdays from 10:00 a.m. to 1:00

The amount of families receiving food is also down from 200 to an average of 130-140 each distribution.

Huston said Food Bank of the Heart Land, Omaha that furnishes most of the food for state food pantries are being given half the amount of food today. "The Government cut the supplies by 20% this year," Huston said. "We are being told they will cut another 20% next year, too." According to Huston, they are writing grants and looking for other outside food sources.

The food pantry accepts overflow of garden produce including lettuce, potatoes, apples and other fruits and vegetables. Check with the food pantry office before bringing fresh garden supplies.






