In consultation with stakeholders and committee members several strategies/items have been identified as areas of need for Bishop Public School to continue serving our students with the lingering pandemic. Any particular item that has been identified as an expenditure in ARP ESSER III funding for prevention and mitigation strategies are as follows:

- Replace HVAC systems to include air purification system
- Replace carpet with solid surface flooring
- 2 buses for social distancing

After a review of student data there are two areas of need identified by the committee. The district will focus on increasing reading and math achievement for minority and economically disadvantaged students taking into consideration those students with learning loss due to COVID-19. The committee recommends the following to address learning loss:

- After school tutoring for Reading and Math
- Summer school
- Replacing student devices for learning
- Lexia Learning intervention program
- Alpha Plus instructional coach with reading and math books that include a digital component
- Alpha Plus Benchmark and Formative Assessments

20% of the ESSER III Allocation = \$209,881.40 Required to Address Learning Loss
