# 6th Grade Science



6th-grade scientists worked on building weather instruments to understand how the weather is measured.



Students explored the essential question, "How can weather data and patterns be used to predict future weather events to mitigate their impacts?"




Classes then placed their instruments in the school courtyard and used data from local weather to help answer questions and see their models work in real-time.

Innovation & Design Catapult Project








After the design and build, a team of engineers completed the testing and evaluation stages of the design process to determine the effectiveness and success of their prototype solutions.



Towards the end of the project, students completed a redesign and reflection in order to determine points of success, as well as areas that could be improved based on the data collected and knowledge gained.



7th Grade English



Readers and writers worked collaboratively to analyze how the elements of RACER work together to form a logical, organized, well-supported paragraph.



Students got to pick to work from texts about musicians, video games, and sports themes.


# Special Education Parent Advisory Group (SEPAG)
