Students in 7th grade health played various board games together to learn about heart health. We hope everyone was a winner!



8th grade scientists are learning about different materials that can be used to build an insulated container. Students worked together to design their own insulated container to test how well it could keep water cool.



Before creating cups, students used their diagramming and modeling skills to set a solid plan in place.



Before doing this work, students used online tools to investigate how energy is transferred from particle to particle and how the matter in a substance behaves at a given temperature.



7th grade artitsts are working on their Alebrijes. **Alebrijes** are brightly colored Mexican folk art sculptures of fantastical (fantasy/mythical) creatures.



The first alebrijes, along with the invention of the term, originated with Mexico City artisan Pedro Linares. Using inspiration from this artist, students designed and constructed an animal that most matched their personality.

7th-grade social studies students are learning about prehistory and how history is not always clear, but we can infer meaning from observations.



Classrooms turned into ancient caves complete with cave drawings.



Using flashlights and notepads, students practiced their skills of artifact analysis and then created presentations to share their findings with each other.


