District Updates

NAMM Best Community for Music Education

- Madison was named a national "Best Community for Music Education" by the NAMM Foundation for the 8th consecutive year. The designation is awarded to districts that demonstrate outstanding achievement in efforts to provide music access and education to all students. Districts that have been recognized by the NAMM Foundation are often held up as models for other educators looking to boost their own music education programs.
- This year Madison joins 738 districts across the country out of 14,000 eligible districts in receiving the prestigious award. The complete list of districts can be found here.



MEC's Green Vision Forum and Green Week Celebrations

- All Madison schools participated in the Madison Environmental Commission's Green Vision Forum on March 31st. Members of each school's "Green Team" presented on the school-based projects alongside members of the environmental club from Drew University. Special thanks to the MEC leadership for including the schools, staff and students in this incredible event!
- MPS also celebrated Green Week during the last week of April. At MHS, the Project Aware Environmental Club presented *Recycling Plastic is Not Enough*, which aimed to alter the approach to improve recycling efforts in the district. Project Aware students collected plastic bottles from around MHS and presented an art display along with informational flyers in the cafeteria. The goal of the display was to raise awareness about how most plastic (approx 86%) is not actually recycled when discarded in recycle bins, but instead ends up in landfills and in the ocean. The MHS green vision solution is to encourage our community to use reusable bottles instead. Each school celebrated green week/green month in its own exciting way throughout the district.

School Updates

Madison High School

- Congratulations to **Artha Abeysinghe** for being named the Class of 2022 valedictorian and **Skylar Walters** for being named the Class of 2022 salutatorian. Artha will be attending Princeton University in the fall while Skylar will be attending Brown University.
- Congratulations to senior **Skylar Walters** who was selected as one of 620 semifinalists to advance to the final round of the 2022 US Presidential Scholars competition. Skylar was selected from nearly 3.7 million graduating high school seniors and over 5000 students who were identified as candidates in the program. Up to 161 students in the country are recognized as US Presidential Scholars. Those earning the distinction will be honored during a National Recognition Program in June and are awarded the Presidential Scholars Medallion.

- On March 13th, six MHS students shaved their heads for the 10th annual Madison, NJ chapter of St. Baldrick's Foundation. Nolan Flanagan (9th grade), Alex Patel (9th grade), Devan Patel (11th grade), Kyle Piechnik (10th grade), Michael McGuire (12th grade), and Eric Selquist (11th grade) shaved their heads to raise funds for research grants for childhood cancer and to stand in solidarity with children going through treatments for cancer. Over the last ten years, the Madison chapter has raised over \$600,000 for St. Baldrick's and childhood cancer research.
- On April 1st, MHS students and staff spent the night in the dark outdoor courtyard, on cold ground, with no comforts of home. The group endured the uncomfortable conditions to raise funds and awareness for Covenant House, a shelter in Newark, focused on helping homeless youth get off the streets. - The MHS Gender Sexuality Alliance organized a Day of Silence on April 8th. Over 150 students and staff participated in the event. The National Day of Silence is a National Youth Movement protesting the silence faced by Gay, Lesbian, Bisexual and Transgender people and their allies in schools. The Day of Silence is a day where participants choose not to speak for the entire day. The deliberate silence of each participant echoes that silence which is caused by harassment, prejudice, bullying, and discrimination in our Nation. Participants broke their silence with a gathering in the courtyard that afternoon.
- Kizito D. Kalima, founder of the <u>Peace Center for Forgiveness & Reconciliation</u>, spoke to students enrolled in **Mr. Bernich's** Holocaust & Genocide class on April 12th. Mr. Kalima is an advocate for Genocide survivors and spoke about his escape from imprisonment and torture in Rwanda.
- On April 5th, the MHS Theatre Program received nominations for our 2021 productions in the Montclair State University Theatre Night Awards program. Last year's musical, *The Drowsy Chaperone*, received 8 nominations:
