District Updates

Board Innovation in Teaching Awards

- The recipients of the third annual Board Innovation in Teaching (IIT) Award for the 2021-22 school year were announced on June 7th. While this year was an incredibly challenging one and the entire staff deserves recognition for the amazing things that have been accomplished, the Board IIT Award builds on this broad success to highlight a few staff members who have led especially impactful or creative initiatives. The recipients for the 2021-22 school year are:
 - Ms. Spelker (CAS) and Ms. Mastaglio (CAS) for their deep dive into the Science of Reading, structured use of data, and innovative instruction to support a tiered system of supports in a 1st Grade classroom. Ms. Spelker and Ms. Mastaglio received a number of nominations that highlighted their teamwork at CAS, work across the three elementary schools, and their successful Madison Teacher Academy course.
 - Ms. Spangler (MJS) for her development of the new TED Talks cycle course at MJS. This elective course provided students with the ability to research and explore a topic of their choosing and present a talk on it to their peers. Ms. Spangler's passion allowed students to engage in learning in a unique and exciting way that will last well beyond their time at MJS.
 - Ms. Blier (MHS) for a wide range of initiatives related to supporting ELL's at MHS. Ms. Blier received multiple nominations for initiatives that will continue into next year, such as having students create bilingual books in English and their home language, codeveloping an integrated math course, and finding innovative ways to build a community of ELL's at the school.
