- Traditional Learning
- Hector school district will not offer virtual learning options for students for the 21-22 school year.



Traditional Learning In-person

- All students in k-12 have a device.
- 9-12 students carry devices home.
- K-8 student devices will be sent home if modifications to in-person learning need to be adjusted.



Sanitization procedures for 21-22

- Disinfect all surfaces regularly
- Consistent hand washing
- Disinfectant foggers-busses, cafe, classrooms, weight rooms, etc.
- Easy access to hand sanitizing stations across campus
- No cafe self-service or water fountains
- Face coverings will not required for the beginning of the 21-22 school year. As the year progresses and the district sees increased active cases, a mask mandate may be necessary to continue in-person learning.

Teacher priorities for re-entry

- Prepare for physical distancing (6ft) in classrooms as much as possible
- Be aware of your own health & health of your students
- Implement procedures for temp checks & safety practices
- Address unfinished learning immediately
- Implement sanitizing procedures
