

- → Most current IEPC (if applicable)

2021-2022 Summer Projects





This summer the first phase of our Sinking Fund Project got underway at Richardson Elementary School (RES). The majority of the work took place at the portion of the building closest to River Road as well as the east wing of RES. The bulk of this work involved abating the floors in these areas of the building and grinding and polishing the floors to ensure a clean and beautiful finish. In addition to work on the floors, Oscoda Area Schools was able to replace many of the exterior doors and windows in these areas to improve energy efficiency, functionality, and aesthetics. Phase two of the project is slated for the summer of 2022 with the remainder of Richardson Elementary School undergoing similar abatement and replacements. We would like to thank our community once again for their support in passing this millage; this work wouldn't be possible without your assistance!

2021-2022 RES Afternoon Pick-Up



Please read the following information carefully. Our goal is student safety. In consultation with our local health and police departments, the following afternoon parent pick-up routine will be implemented.

- Teachers will walk all students to the buses and to pick-up areas
- Parents who pick-up their children must have a picture I.D. with them.
- Social distancing protocols should be followed

Pick-up areas will be close to the parking lot. We will have signs marking the areas. This
area will be barricaded from traffic. Please see the picture below.



No vehicles will be allowed to enter the RES circle during pick-up time. Any vehicle parked in the RES circle should plan to exit the area prior to 2:30 p.m. Barricades will be set up at 2:30 p.m. and will not be removed until buses have left the parking lot.



Classroom Dismissal Routine:

- Dismissal will be staggered (2:50 3:05) throughout the building.
- Teachers will have the student/parent pick-up information on their clipboard. The
 person picking up the child must match the clipboard information that was supplied by
 the office. I.D. will be required, if needed, to verify identity. If clarification is
 needed, the office will be notified and concerns will be sorted out.
- Students being picked up will be released to verified family members who are waiting in the assigned pickup location for that grade.
- Pick-up locations will be identified with signage.
- Students will not be released without the teacher acknowledging that the student is safely in the care of the parent/guardian.
- All students will remain with their teachers until released to parents or to their bus.
 The teacher will walk students to their assigned buses. Students identified as "pick-up" whose parents are not located, will return to the school office with the teacher.

2021-2022 RES Morning Drop-Off



Please read the following information carefully. Our goal is to make our campus very safe. In consultation with our local health and police departments, the following morning drop-off routine will be implemented.

- Student morning drop-off is between 7:40 a.m. and 8:00 a.m.
- We have designated drop-off locations in the front circle at RES for students based on grade level.
- We ask all families to be patient and very careful when driving near the school.
- Parents dropping off 5th grade, Young Owls Preschool, 3rd, and/or 4th graders should stay to the right and go behind the greenhouse to the designated drop-off location.
- Parents dropping off Kindergarten, 1st, and/or 2nd graders will go straight to their designated location (main entrance or just to the east of the main entrance) to drop off their children.
- We are asking that parents stay in their vehicles when dropping off children.
- ALL children should exit the vehicle from the RIGHT side only (passenger side).
- Parents should pull up in front of the designated RES grade level entrance. The child safely exits the vehicle on the right and the parent pulls away when it is safe to do so.
- Please do not drop students off prior to 7:40 a.m. as doors will be locked. At 7:40 a.m. a RES staff member will open the door and supervise the drop-off location until 8:00 a.m.
- Breakfast stations will be located throughout the building.
- Social distancing protocols will be in place.
- For late drop-off, after 8:00 a.m., parents will enter at the main entrance and sign students in at the RES office.

Our 6^{th} grade students will start their day at the high school building for their Enrichment Class. Please drop 6^{th} graders off at the main entrance of the high school. Sixth graders return to RES at 9:00 a.m. for the

remainder of their day.

<u>Please Note:</u> For the health and safety of our young children, we are limiting the number of visitors in our building at the current time. We are requesting that parents only enter the building when absolutely necessary. We appreciate our families for doing their part to keep our students and staff as safe as possible.

Important Technology News

Our students will be issued a laptop for the 2021-2022 school year. Below you will find the dates and times for laptop distribution. It is important that you make it to the scheduled times. The beginning of the school year is a busy time for all and we look forward to seeing everyone back!

Key Points Regarding Laptop Distribution

- Guardians need to be present to sign for laptop.
- Laptops will not be issued to the student until the parent has signed the Acceptable Use Policy (AUP).
- A laptop will not be issued to your student if they did not return the laptop last year.

It is imperative that your student's device is cared for. Replacement parts have been on order for many devices, but most items are on back order with no current estimated time of arrival.

Technology Device Frequently Asked Questions

- Who does the Laptop belong to?
 - Even though each student is responsible for his/her laptop that is assigned to him/her, it is still the property of OAS. It is comparable to a textbook. Since the students do not own the Laptops, there is an Acceptable Use Agreement that they must sign and follow.
- When will students receive their Laptop? If a student has his/her own device, is he/she able to use that and opt out?

 Students, both current and new, will receive their Laptop during laptop distribution times assigned. These devices are valuable instructional tools and willbe used daily. Every student is required to use the school issued Laptop. OAS wants students to take advantage of this valuable resource.
- Since the Laptops look the same, how will students tell them apart?

 Each Laptop has a bar code label on the bottom of it. This label shows the modeland serial number. Laptops will be issued name tag labels for younger grade levels going forward. Students are not to remove the labels off or add any stickers of their own.
- Will students be able to take them home every night, on vacations, or during breaks? Students will be able to take the devices home every night to complete class assignments. They will also be allowed to take them on vacations, during winter break and spring break. However, at the end of the year, the Laptops will be collected for the summer and then handed back out at the beginning of the next year. Each student will receive the same Laptop that he/she had the previous school year.
- What happens if a student does not have internet at home?

 Students may do school work with Google docs at home without the internet.

 Many assignments and handouts can be downloaded while at school. However, the Laptop is able to connect to wireless internet in any location. A limited number of district provided hot spots are available to students with NO internet.
- What happens if a student leaves OAS?

 If a student leaves the district, it is his/her responsibility to return the device. If it is not returned, the student will be charged the full cost of the device.
- When a student graduates, can he/she keep the Laptop?

 No. The Laptop belongs to OAS; the students will not get to keep them when they graduate. Laptops will be returned in a similar fashion that textbooks have been collected for years. The only occasion that this may happen is if the laptop is at the end of the replacement cycle. Seniors will be notified if it is a possibility.

- What happens if the Laptop or charger stops working/breaks?

 If this happens, the student is to report the Laptop or charger to the Helpdesk immediately. If the problem can be solved quickly, the student will be able to continue using the device. If the problem is serious, it will be taken into service by the Technology Department and fixed in a timely manner. There are a certain number of loaner Laptops that can be given out if needed.
- What who pays for the device if it becomes damaged?

 Similar to textbooks, students are responsible for taking adequate care of the Laptop assigned to them. Ultimately the student is responsible for any damages to his or her device. There is a chart above of the most common repair costs if uninsured. Insurance is optional but highly recommended. Insurance costs \$25 annually. Purchasing insurance will keep you from being charged repair costs in the event the device becomes damaged.
- What happens if the Laptop or charger is lost or stolen?

 If a Laptop or charger is lost or stolen, students need to report it immediately to the Helpdesk.
- What happens when a student forgets to charge his/her Laptop?

 There are a certain number of loaner Laptops that can be given out for the day if needed. It is the responsibility of the student to bring his or her charged Laptop to class on a daily basis.
- What log-in will the students use, and can the device be used for personal use? The students will have a district login that allows them to log into their Laptop to work on assignments. However, even though they can log in outside of school, the Laptops are not intended for personal use.
- Can other students or parents use the Laptop?

 No. Only the student that the Laptop is issued to can use the device.

2020-2021 Transportation Information

The Oscoda Area Schools Transportation Department is ready to roll into the new school year and we can't wait to see our students on August 30^{th} .

We ask for your patience and understanding as we begin the year. We want ensure that our students are safe and healthy. Please note the following rules that must be followed by all bus riders and drivers:

- 1. ALL STUDENTS AND STAFF MUST WEAR A FACEMASK before entering the bus and throughout the entire bus ride.
- 2. If your student forgets their mask, or does not have one, masks will be available at the front of the bus.
- 3. If your student is medically unable to wear a facemask, you must provide documentation signed by your doctor to your child's school.
- 4. Hand sanitizer will be available on all of our school buses.
- 5. If you are able to drive your child to school, we encourage you to do so.
- 6. If your child would like to walk or ride a bike to school on the bike path, parental permission must be on file with the school office.

We would like to remind you of the following important safety tips:

- ▶ <u>YELLOW</u> flashing overhead lights on the school bus, you must be prepared to stop and be on the lookout for children coming from any direction as they are often unpredictable.
- ▶ <u>RED</u> flashing overhead lights on the school bus, you MUST stop. It is illegal to pass a school bus with flashing red overhead lights on no matter what direction you are going.
