Furniture and Cabinetmaking III: Cabinetmaking

This one-year course will enable students to further develop skills and proficiency of what they have learned in Cabinetmaking I and II. All students will build a cabinet from cost estimates, lumber quantity and cut lists that they have calculated. Emphasis is placed on stationary power tool certification including disk sander, combination sander, wide belt sander and planer. Furniture and Cabinetmaking II is a prerequisite for this course.
