

ORDINANCE NO. F #6

TO PROVIDE FOR THE ISSUING OF A LICENSE FOR THE KEEPING
OF DOGS.

Be it ordained by the Board of Trustees of the town of
Fleming, Colorado.

Section 1. That no dog shall be allowed to run at large
or be kept within the limits of the Town of Fleming except as
hereinafter provided.

Section 2. Any person living or stopping with the town
of Fleming who is the owner, or keeper of a dog within said town
after the first day of May in each year without having a license
so to do in accordance with the provisions of this ordinance,
shall be deemed guilty of a violation of this ordinance and upon
conviction thereof, be fined not less than Five Dollars (\$5.00)
nor more than Ten Dollars (\$10.00) and costs of suit.

Section 3. Any person desiring to keep a dog within the
Town of Fleming shall be permitted to do so by paying a license
fee of \$ 2.50 dollars per annum for each male dog and \$5.00
dollars per annum for each female dog so proposed to be kept.

Section 4. The City Clerk shall issue a license to any
person desiring to keep a dog as aforesaid upon the payment in
advance of the license fee, which license shall be numbered in the
order of their issue, and the City Clerk shall furnish a metal
plate or tag with each license bearing the number of the license,
which metal plate or tag shall be attached by the owner to the
collar to be worn by the dog so licensed.

Section 5. All dog licenses shall expire on the 30th day
of April of each year, and it is hereby made the duty of the City
Marshal to take all dogs found running at large within said town
without wearing a metal plate or tag thereon showing that such
dogs have been licensed to stay in said town, and kill and bury
the same beyond the town limits. No dog shall be killed under
the provisions of this act by the Town Marshal without giving the
owner thereof twenty-four hours notice in which to procure a li-
cense for said dog, at the expiration of said time if he fails,
refuses or neglects to procure a license as aforesaid, and still
allows said animal to run at large, the same shall be killed and
buried by the Marshal as aforesaid. Also, if at the expiration
of the twenty-four hours aforesaid owner shall fail, refuse or
neglect to procure a license for said dog and shall keep, harbor
and protect the same and keep it from running at large, it is
hereby made the duty of the Town Marshal to have said owner
prosecuted for a violation of Section 2 of this ordinance.

Section 6. All dogs, the owners of which are unknown, shall
be killed at once, as provided in Section 5 of this ordinance,
provided, this shall not apply to dogs belonging outside the limits

of said town that may be following their owners in said town.

Section 7. A license shall be due on all dogs coming into said town after May 1st of each year, and on all dogs from the date that this ordinance goes into effect and shall be paid in full to April 30th of each and every year or fraction thereof on dogs not paid nor coming into said town after May 1st of each year.

Section 8. Any person owning, having or harboring a dog of cross or savage disposition, or one having such a reputation, who shall allow such dog to run at large at any time without being securely muzzled, shall be guilty of a violation of this ordinance and on conviction thereof shall be fined not less than \$5.00 nor more than \$100.00 and costs of suit, and such a dog may be killed by any person upon whose premises it may be found.

Section 9. The fees of the Town Marshal under these ordinances shall be \$1.00 for each dog killed and buried.
