AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE SUBMISSION TO THE QUALIFIED VOTERS OF THE TOWN OF FLEMING, COLORADO, AT THE REGULAR ELECTION OF OFFICERS FOR SAID TOWN TO BE HELD IN SAID TOWN ON THE 6th DAY OF APRIL, A. D. 1920, THE QUESTION OF AUTHORIZING THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF SAID TOWN TO ERECT ELECTRIC LIGHT WORKS FOR THE PURPOSE OF SUPPLYING SAID TOWN AND THE INHABITANTS THEREOF WITH ELECTRIC LIGHT AND POWER, SAID WORKS TO BE OWNED, MANAGED AND OPERATED BY THE SAID TOWN.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE TOWN OF FLEMING, COLORADO:

Section 1. That at the regular election of officers for said town, to be held in the Town of Fleming on Tuesday, April 6th, A. D. 1920, the question of authorizing the Board of Trustees of said town to erect electric light works, for the purpose of supplying said town and the inhabitants thereof with electric lights and power, said works to be owned, managed and operated by the town, be and the same is hereby submitted to such qualified voters of said town as are taxpayers under the law for their determination.

Section 2. The question so submitted shall be voted on at said election by the voters qualified as aforesaid at the following place in said town, to-wit: Office of Munday and Horn, the same being the voting place for the said election of officers for said town.

The voting shall be done by ballot of the form hereine after provided, and said election shall be in all respects, as nearly as may be held and conducted in the manner prescribed by law in case of elections for municipal officers.

Section 3. The ballot to be used in the voting upon the question above submitted shall be prepared and furnished by the Town Clerk to the Judges of election to be by them furnished to the voters, and shallbe in the following printed form, and shall be deposited in a separate ballot box provided by the Town Clerk for such purpose:

For the election to be held in the Town of Fleming, on Tuesday the 6th day of April, A. D. 1920.

Question:

"Shall the Board of Trustees of the Town of Fleming, be authorized to erect Electric Light Works, for the purpose of supplying said town and the inhabitants thereof with electric light and power, said works to be owned ,managed and operated by the town."

(The voter will place and (X) in the space opposite and to the right of the answer below which indicated his choice, and then deposit his ballot in the separate ballot box provided for such purpose.)

The said ballot shall be cast by each voter by marking an (X) opposite the group of words expressing his choice, in the manner now provided by law for voting upon amendments to the constitution of the State of Colorado.

Section 4. No ballot for or against said question shall be received by the judges, unless the person offering the same shall be a qualified voter of the Town of Fleming, and a taxpayer under the law.

Section 5. The following named persons are hereby appointed as judges and clerks of said election, being the judges and clerks at said regular election.

Judges: -- Chas. D. Warren, Albert Worthley and B. S. Munday.

Clerks: -- D. Grant and C. O. Briels.

Section 6. The vote at said election on the question afore said shall be canvassed and returned, and the return made and the result declared in the same manner, as nearly as may be, as provided by law for the canvass, return and declaring of the result of votes cast, at an election of municipal officers.

Section 7. A notice of time and place of said election shall be published in the Fleming News, a newspaper of general circulation printed in the Town of Fleming in the County of Logan, and State of Colorad, and a copy of said notice shall be posted at the a said polling place and in one other conspicuous place in said town, at least fifteen (15) days before such election, announcing the time, place and object of election, and the clerk of the town of Fleming is hereby charged with the duty of effectuating this provision, which said notice shall be in the following form, to-wit:

ELECTION NOTICE

Pursuant to Ordinance No. 18, of the Town of Fleming, Colorado, adopted and approved the 1st day of March A. D. 1920, public notice is hereby given that at a regular election of officers for said town, to be held in said town on Tuesday, the 6th of April, A. D. 1920, there will be submitted to the voters of the Town of Fleming who are taxpayers under the law, the following question:

"Shall the Board of Trustees of the Town of Fleming be authorized to erect electric light works for the purpose of supplying said town and the inhabitants thereof with electric light and power, said works to be owned, managed and operated by the said town?"

The question so submitted will be voted on at said election by the voters of the Town of Fleming who are taxpayers under the law at the Office of Munday & Horn, in the Town of Fleming, Colorado.

Separate ballots to be used in voting upon the question above submitted will be furnished to the voters by the judges of election, to be deposited in a separate ballot box which will be provided for that purpose.

The polls will be opened at seven o'clock in the morning and continue open until seven o'clock in the evening of said day.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, The Board of Trustees of the Town of Fleming, in the State of Colorado, has caused this notice to be published and posted as required by law this 1st day of March, A. D. 1920.

Section 8. This ordinance, after its passage, shall be recorded in a book kept for that purpose, be authenticated by the signatures of the mayor and clerk, and shall be published in the Fleming News, a newspaper published within the limits of the Town of Fleming.

Section 9. This ordinance being an ordinance calling a special election shall take effect and be in force upon the expiration of five (5) days after it has been so published.
