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6. FINANCIAL REPORT

Merinda Reisch, Business Manager, explained the Fund Balance report includes a comparison between this year and last year. According to the fund balance June's revenue was \$4,380,143.52 and the expenses were \$3,477,510.18 with the year-to-date revenue being at \$23,032,680.23 and expenses at \$21,376,013.40. She said transfers haven't been completed yet for the insurance, preschool, grants and capital projects funds. She is waiting to hear from the auditor on that. Mrs. Reisch told the Board that in the past, she has received an approval letter from the state for CEP (Community Eligibility Provision). CEP allows all students to receive free meals at school. To qualify for CEP, districts use a formula based on the percentage of students eligible for free meals based on other programs they may be enrolled in (SNAP and TANF). The district was able to use the same percentage rate as last year, which was at 89.20% and will be able to stay at this rate for four years. This is the second year of this four-year cycle. Director Paolucci inquired as to the total amounts of funds that need to be transferred. Superintendent Lovato said that will be around \$1.2 million dollars. FINANCIAL REPORT APPROVED AS PRESENTED

7. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT AND RECOMMENDATIONS

The Primary construction project is not going near as quickly as the district would like. Superintendent Lovato said October 15 is still the final date of completion. There have been issues with the roof leaking and there have been issues dealing with the roofing company. A shade structure has been erected near the Kindergarten playground and landscaping should begin soon as well.

Professional development for the 2019-2020 school year will consist of social/emotional training. The district is using the 7 Mindsets curriculum. Certified staff will attend a training on July 31 and classified staff will attend a training on August 23.

Formerly known as New Horizons, Superintendent Lovato introduced the S.E.A.L. Academy and the Tiger Trades Academy. The SEAL Academy will be ran by the Santa Fe Trail BOCES. Superintendent Lovato said staff is working on putting together an orientation meeting in the next couple of weeks to introduce the Tiger Trades Academy.

The insurance adjustor is on vacation right now, but he has said the south end of the bus barn will need to be replaced due to the fire. An alternative site will be required to house the buses during construction. Mr. Ansley has found a location at the cost of \$1600.00 per month. It is a secure facility with the amenities needed for the buses. Another activity bus will need to be purchased and this will be an agenda item for next month's meeting.

Superintendent Lovato said the sound system quote is being revamped. This quote is for new sound systems at the Junior/Senior High School. A quote should be received for next month's meeting.

There are still some unfilled positions, which prompted Superintendent Lovato to declare a teacher shortage. This declaration allows the district to hire retired teachers.

Director Leyba stated she has spoken with some parents regarding the first day of school and late start. She asked Superintendent Lovato to clarify this. He said August 12 is the first day of school for all students. Regarding late start, letters will be sent out at the end of this week or the beginning of next week. If a student receives a letter, this will allow the student to participate in late start and will allow the student eight excused absences. They will begin school on August 26. Late start is only for secondary students and not elementary students. If a student receives a letter and would like to begin school on August 12, they may do so.

There is an SCAP (Student Centered Accountability Project) meeting on July 23 in Breckenridge beginning at 3:00 p.m. East Otero School District is a participating member of SCAP. A diagnostic review of the district is scheduled for September 23-25. The meeting will be to discuss the upcoming review. Director Leyba said she will plan on attending. She said she is excited for the review and this will allow the community, parents and students to see what our schools offer. She said there is more to our schools than just a test score.

The new bleachers for Tiger Gym were delivered and installation will take 10-12 days. Superintendent Lovato said once the old bleachers were removed, heavy cleaning was required.

Director Paolucci asked how many students will be able to attend Tiger Trades Academy. Superintendent Lovato said right now 60 students can attend. Mr. McNerney said there are some jobs already lined up. Superintendent

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Lovato clarified that the Tiger Trades Academy is a program offered by the Junior/Senior High School and it is not its own entity. Currently, it is being housed at the Inspiration Field building on 15th and San Juan, but hopefully by December it will be moved to East School.
