7. FINANCIAL REPORT

Merinda Reisch, Business Manager, said the Fund Balance income was \$3.1 million and expenses were \$2.6 million. There are still some accounts showing a negative balance due to transfers not being made yet. Superintendent Lovato said once the transfers are made, the balance will decrease significantly. Currently, the balance is at \$2.2 million and after the transfers, the balance will be closer to \$800,000. FINANCIAL REPORT APPROVED AS PRESENTED

8. PRESENTATIONS

Building Safe School Reports:

- Julie Miller, Primary School Principal, said enrollment was slightly down this year with a total enrollment of 322 students. The average daily attendance rate was up with Kindergarten and First Grade at 93% and Second Grade at 91.33%. Out of school suspensions decreased by six. Last year's number was ten and there were four this year. The end of year DIBELS data showed 65% of the Kindergarten students at or above benchmark levels, while First Grade students were at 59% and Second Grade students were at 55%.
- Claudia Apodaca, Intermediate School Principal, stated enrollment was slightly down this year, from 523 students to 503 students. The average daily attendance rate was at 92.7% compared to 93.8% last year and the average class size was at 20 students per class. Mrs. Apodaca said behavior incidents decreased from 156 last year to 93 this year. She said there are 16 incoming Third Grade students, 26 Fourth Grade students and 51 Fifth Grade students currently attending summer school.
- Dan Nuschy, Junior/Senior High School Principal, was unable to attend the meeting. Superintendent Lovato
 explained suspensions were down this year at the Junior/Senior High School while enrollment was up. He
 stated something will need to be done in order to keep some of the upper classmen in school. Director Leyba
 inquired about the dropout rate. Superintendent Lovato said the number comes from our Infinite Campus data.

9. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT AND RECOMMENDATIONS

Superintendent Lovato said the Primary construction project is coming along. It is beginning to look like a building. There are some roof issues with leaks and they are being taken care of. Overall, completion is early to mid-September, but the final punch list is still scheduled for October. The landscaping is taking shape. There is a meeting on Wednesday to discuss door access.

Regarding the fire damage at the transportation department, Superintendent Lovato said the district is waiting on the insurance company and things are at a standstill. He said a new bus will need to be purchased to replace the bus that was totaled in the fire and there are two more buses that are questionable. He said he doesn't see the buses being able to be housed at the transportation department this fall and he and Mr. Miell are currently looking at an alternative location to park the buses.

Summer school began on June 3. All three buildings are around the 80% attendance rate. The summer numbers for food service are up. Last year, the best day was around 100 served and this year there is around 200 served per day. Meals are being offered at both the Primary and Intermediate Schools. Transportation services seem to be working well for summer school.
