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9. FINANCIAL REPORT

Merinda Reisch, Business Manager, was unable to attend the meeting due to illness. Superintendent Lovato recommended approval of the financial report. **FINANCIAL REPORT APPROVED AS PRESENTED**

10. PRESENTATIONS

Cindy Haberman

Mrs. Haberman was unable to attend the meeting. Superintendent Lovato read her intent to retire to the Board.

District Accountability Committee (DAC) Report

Members of the District Accountability Committee gave a report to the Board (Michael DelDuca, Audrey Berg and Sarah Zane). There were three categories mentioned:

ICAP (Individual Career Academic Planning)

Mrs. Zane said parents are concerned that the district is looking at a work-force readiness career pathway for students. She urged the Board to find evidence-based research to back up their decision if that is the route they choose. The concern is students may be pushed away from the college bound pathway.

Parental Involvement

Mrs. Zane asked that language used in meetings (acronyms, etc.) be explained to parents and that the audience is taken into consideration. She feels not enough explanation is given and these corrections may help to increase parental involvement.

Mrs. Berg shared her experience with attending the district accountability meeting. She said a follow up meeting was held with the administration and was very pleased to go to that meeting. Mrs. Berg also sits on the Communities That Care (CTC) committee. She said CTC is working on improving the parent engagement with the schools.

School Safety Planning

Mrs. Zane stated another concern regarding school lock down drills. She said research is showing these drills are causing trauma to students. She asked the Board to research the impact these drills have on teachers and students.

Science Curriculum Presentation

Ms. Linda Langin-Maxwell with Houghton-Mifflin-Harcourt said she wanted to show her support for the adoption of Science Dimensions. She said Science Dimensions is an exciting new program. The curriculum is based on Colorado science standards. The textbook is also available online which will be helpful to parents.

11. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT AND RECOMMENDATIONS

Superintendent Lovato said the Primary School construction project is gaining ground. Floors are being poured, as well as framing work being completed.

The Tiger Talkers were recognized: At the national qualifying meet, Caitlyn Dieckmann was 2nd alternate in Drama and the team of Austin Kurtz and Caitlyn Dieckmann were named 1st alternate to Nationals. Congratulations were sent to the pair.

Superintendent Lovato took a moment to congratulate Yliana Garcia, a 5th grade student, who won the Elks Lodge sponsored Otero Hoop Shoot, the Canon City Hoop Shoot and the Salida Hoop Shoot. She travels to Arvada for the regional competition.

The Colorado School Districts Self-Insurance Pool (CSDSIP) is proposing an 84% increase for insurance. This increase is due to statewide property loss due to damaging storms last year. The projected cost is \$248,000. Superintendent Lovato said he will be looking into this.

The 7th grade orientation will be held March 27, 2019. The information has been released on social media, as well as to parents.

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Superintendent Lovato reviewed the beginning of year (BOY) to middle of year (MOY) data for grades K-8. Director Ayala said it seems students who are performing above benchmark are stuck and there doesn't seem to be a lot of movement. She said she is pleased that the students who are below level are improving, but doesn't want the above level kids to be stagnant.

Superintendent Lovato said he has a meeting on Thursday regarding New Horizons/Tiger Learning Center (TLC) with BOCES. He said he is looking at about 10% per grade level of students who would benefit from a work force readiness program. He said an idea that is being considered is declaring an alternative learning campus in the district. Superintendent Lovato said he feels that offering a more diverse curriculum for our students will benefit all students.

Regarding staffing patterns for next year, Superintendent Lovato said he is looking for an additional Math and English teacher at the Junior/Senior High School. He said there are some elementary positions already open and he is hoping to find a social worker.

Summer school will begin the first of June. Notification will be sent home after spring break. He said a questionnaire will be sent out in hopes to find out if transportation is a barrier for summer school attendance, as attendance will be a stipulation for non-retention.

Superintendent Lovato reviewed the snow day process. He explained his process on making the decision on whether or not to call a snow day process. Every district in the valley is different. La Junta Public Schools has many students who have to wait for school bus in the elements, as well as crossing guards at the elementary schools. If the roads are slick, this can be hazardous for those staff members. He takes into consideration students who drive to school and explained his ultimate goal is to keep students and staff safe. If any further days have to be called off due to weather, those days will be made up so we stay above the required student hours required by the Colorado Department of Education.

Superintendent Lovato said he is working closely with Mr. Canaday and GCG, Inc. and the district will be assuming control of the maintenance department on July 1, 2019.
