The 2021-2022 school year has finally blasted off and we are officially flying into the new school year. This school year will be another exciting one; we have hired outstanding new staff members to combine with the already fantastic people we have on board, and we have a large number of new students and their families. There will be new opportunities available to students to help them grow academically, and new procedures and practices that will raise the level of educational expectations at Mission Valley.

On August 11th we kicked off the Back 2 School All-Staff Inservice (face-to-face) with a catered breakfast, new staff introductions, and message of support and encouragement by Senator Brenda Dietrich and Representative Chuck Schmidt. Over the course of the next several days building administrators and staff received professional development on topics including teaching reading, using data to drive decisions, and working in their professional learning communities.

This year we added to our Open House a Back 2 School Pep Rally which was attended by over 400 Viking Fans......how great it was to see everyone having a great time and getting back to the "norm".

This year USD 330 Mission Valley will move into Year 4 of the Kansas Education Systems Accreditation 5-year process. The vision for education in the state of Kansas is that "Kansas leads the world in the success of each student". The ultimate goal is that each high school graduate will be successful. What is a "Successful High School Graduate"? A successful high school graduate has the academic and cognitive preparation, technical and employability skills, and civic engagement to be successful in postsecondary education, in the attainment of an industry recognized certification, or in the workforce, without the need for remediation. It is recognized that not every high school graduate needs to go to college. It is recognized that over 70% of the jobs in the near future will require certification at some level.

Along with striving to produce successful high school graduates other results will be looked at. We want to make sure that our students are receiving the social-emotional support that they need, that we know what our Kindergarten students need when they first set foot in the school, that each student has an Individual Plan of Study that supports the vision for their future, and that after graduation our students are demonstrating success at the post-secondary level. We will be exploring relationships within the Mission Valley School Community, evaluating curriculum and instruction, technology, student engagement, district/school climate, etc....

Thank you for your continued support of USD 330 Mission Valley and I hope each student, parent, patron and faculty member has a great 21-22 school year.

#### Unofficial Minutes (subject to Board approval) REGULAR BOARD OF EDUCATION MEETING – August 9, 2021

President, Jacob Durkes called the regular meeting of the Board of Education of Mission Valley USD #330 to order at 7:00 p.m. in the Mission Valley Elementary Commons Board members present were Clinton Lambotte, Jon Deters, Mistina Kraus, Jim Rudeen, Clipper Goodrich and Tuff Stephenson. The superintendent and board clerk also attended.

New teachers Kevin Vanderbilt, Caleb Olsen, Ian Kalas and Cade Fisk introduced themselves.

Tuff Stephenson moved, seconded by Clipper Goodrich, to adopt the agenda with the following additions; VIII. Receive B. COVID-Mask Requirements and E. Health Insurance (Action Requested). Motion passed unanimously.

Tuff Stephenson moved, seconded by Jon Deters, to approve the consent agenda as presented. Motion passed unanimously.

Items in the consent agenda that were approved include: approval of minutes of the July 19, 2021 regular board meeting; approval of clerk's report and treasurer's report as presented; approval of warrants in the amount of \$206,491.06; approval of extra duty pay in the amount of \$2,530; approval of transfers from the general fund to the at-risk fund in the amount of \$20,000.00 and to the voc-ed fund in the amount of \$40,000.00; resignation of Veronica Willard as assistant cook, Elaine Parker as custodian, Matt Bisnett as paraprofessional, transfer of Linda Willey from paraprofessional to assistant cook, hiring of Matt Bisnett as custodian, Jason Palenske as Bus Driver, Megan Taylor as paraprofessional, Rebecca Bouws as teacher aide and Carrie Hewes as assistant cook; and approval of administrators written reports as presented.

Jon Deters moved, seconded by Tuff Stephenson, to approve the out of district student requests as presented. Motion passed unanimously.

Tuff Stephenson moved, seconded by Clipper Goodrich, to publish the notice of hearing of the 2021-22 revenue neutral rate as presented, in the Wabaunsee County Signal-Enterprise on August 20, 2021. Motion passed unanimously.

Tuff Stephenson moved, seconded by Clipper Goodrich, to publish the notice of hearing of the 2021-22 budget as presented in the Wabaunsee County Signal-Enterprise on August 20, 2021. Motion passed unanimously.

Discussion was had regarding funding of a program for COVID-19 testing in schools. The superintendent will proceed with submitting a proposed plan.

Information was presented about mask requirements on buses and school vehicles. Masks need to be worn if transporting others.

Updated job descriptions for the board clerk and treasurer were presented for review.

A list of supplemental positions for 2021-22 was presented.

Jim Rudeen moved, seconded by Clipper Goodrich, to approve the 2021-22 health and dental benefit premium changes and contribution rates as presented and recommended (by the staff benefits committee). Motion passed unanimously. Changes will be effective October 1, 2021.

Mr. Hasenbank, Mrs. Johnston and Mr. Wild gave building and program reports.

Jacob Durkes moved, seconded by Tuff Stephenson, to go into executive session at 8:14 p.m. to discuss the latest proposal for increasing the base pay rate from the teachers pursuant to the exception for employer-employee negotiations under KOMA, and that they return to open session in the same room at 8:24 p.m. Motion passed unanimously. The superintendent and board clerk also attended.

The meeting reconvened in open session at 8:24 p.m.

Tuff Stephenson moved, seconded by Clipper Goodrich, to approve the resignation of Amelia Hancock as assistant cross country coach, hiring of Kevin Vanderbilt as pe/weights teacher, 9<sup>th</sup> grade sponsor, assistant football coach, summer weights and head high school track coach, Cade Fiske as assistant cross country coach and Jennifer Spoon as 5<sup>th</sup> grade long term sub. Motion passed unanimously.

Tuff Stephenson moved, seconded by Jon Deters, to adjourn the meeting. Motion passed unanimously. Meeting adjourned at 8:28 p.m.

The US Armed Services will have their recruiters available to assist with financial funding options for college, as well as present career readiness opportunities.





#### Viking HOUR

Viking HOUR will focus on college/career readiness, socio-emotional character development, academic intervention, team-building, career speaker engagements, and civic engagements all done to help prepare the students for current and post-secondary success.

The counseling department will be directly assisting the students, the teachers and administrators in this area by introducing a comprehensive school counseling program that includes curriculum and guidance lessons that are developmentally sound and can be directly tied to the needs of the students.

The lessons and assignments are geared to fit the student at their specific grade/age level. The students will have the entire week to complete the lessons and assignments that are assigned to them weekly.



Mission Valley will sponsor the Apply Kansas event on 10/1/2021 from 2-3:30 p.m. for MV Seniors. This event will bring in college admissions representatives to help students with the application process to the colleges of their interests for the upcoming 2022-23 academic year. They will also help students to answer any questions they have about post-secondary transition. The event is filled with college-swag giveaways, fun, and pictures of the students with the pennants of the colleges for which they applied. Parents are welcome to join in the festivities.




#### Scholarships are a Priority for all GRADE LEVELS!!!
