The mission of the Owen D. Young Central School is to provide an excellent educational environment in which all students can achieve success and become contributing citizens.

I. Call to Order and Pledge of Allegiance

The meeting was called to order at 6:30 p.m. followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

II. Board of Education

a. District Title I services presentation. Superintendent Fahey spoke about the ODY K-6 school-wide program in ELA and Math. The district uses data from STAR assessments and state assessments to determine areas of focus. Remediation is also provided, if necessary. In grades 7-12, students attend Learning Lab if they earn scores of 1 or 2 on state assessments, or achieve less than 80% in Math and ELA classes. If students earn grades above 80% for two consecutive marking periods they may be removed from Learning Lab.

On Wednesday, April 12, from 5:30 7 p.m., the PTO will host a literacy night in the gym.
