

Join us tonight at a Special Meeting of the Windsor Unified School District Board of Trustees to discuss COVID protocols for our schools. The primary goal is to keep kids in school, and our current protocols are not meeting that goal to the degree we would prefer. Thus, the District is considering mandating mask use outdoors at campuses as well as indoors and shortening the eating time at lunch to 14 minutes, keeping the exposure window closed. This would allow more students to be considered for modified quarantine, which keeps them in class, rather than being forced to send them home on full quarantine.

While not currently mandated, this action has been “strongly recommended” by the Sonoma County Department of Health.

There will also be discussion of the District creating a new COVID Command Center, expanding testing teams and redistributing them, and the use of a new app called CrisisGo, which will help with data collection and management for testing, quarantine and vaccines, among other things.

We know this continues to be a challenging time for families, and that it feels as though plans are in constant flux. Much of that is the nature of changing guidance but some of it is simply the nature of a pandemic and the organizations trying to figure out how to safely respond.

We’re interested to hear our community’s thoughts on these ideas when we discuss them at the meeting. The open portion of the meeting starts at 5:30 p.m., and is being held in person in the Town Council Chambers at 9291 Old Redwood Hwy, Bldg 400, Windsor, CA 95492. This is open to the public, however attendees will be required to wear masks. Public Comment will be in person only.
