## Dear Parents/Guardians

West Virginia high school graduation requirements state that students must complete at least four (4) mathematics credits; one must be Algebra I. Your child can receive this math credit in two ways. The student may take the Algebra I course or the student can take a combination of two courses called Algebra I and Algebra I Lab. The Algebra I Lab will be counted as a math credit and will count as one of the four mathematics requirements.

Putnam County has implemented a policy regarding Algebra I. The policy states that the student must score at least 75% (cannot miss more than 10 questions) on the Algebra I Exit Exam in order to receive credit for the course. A student must take this exam as part of Algebra I.

The Algebra I Exit Exam will be given at the end of the class. This test will be a multiple choice test on the State Content Standards and Objectives for Algebra I. All Algebra I students will be given practice tests on the identified objectives throughout the course. If a student fails the Algebra I Exit Exam, the teacher will make provisions for the student to retake the test in a timely fashion. The student may retake the test two times.

Included with this letter you will find a sample of the Algebra I Exit Exam with answer key.
