Group Sizes	 The maximum group size that may convene indoors in a single room should be determined by physical distancing opportunities in the classroom.

	 Each school will be assigned a school nurse.

	 Field Trips (STEM only) may be available later this fall.
	 Open Houses and Prep Days – Masks are required for all adults and

	Athletic events - Masks are required for indoor events.
Meals	 Food Service protocols may vary by school and grade level. Each
	school will determine the best procedures based on school context.
	Cafeteria tables will be used with students sitting in their static
	groups or sitting on the same side of the table.
	Breakfast options will include a grab and go OR a hot meal, and all
	meals are free to students.
	All schools are encouraged to have parents submit applications
	online or in print for Free and Reduced Meals. This should be done
	as soon as possible for qualifying pandemic funding for families.

Monitoring of COVID	When to Stay Home
Symptoms	Students who are ill should stay home regardless of symptoms. *
	All covid-19 symptoms should be monitored closely.*

	Quarantine Requirements for Students Who are Exposed to Covid-19
	Students who are considered a close contact to a positive Covid-19
	case will be required to quarantine at home for 10 days, unless one
	of the following occurs:
	✓ Student will be exempt from quarantine if he/she has tested
	positive within last 90 days
	✓ Student will be exempt from quarantine if he/she is fully
	vaccinated

Environment Cleaning and Personal Hygiene	 Student may return on day 8 of quarantine if not symptomatic and a negative test is received on day 5-7. A close contact is defined as a person who is within 6 feet of an infected for a total of 15 minutes within a 24 hour period, someone providing care at home to someone with Covid-19, someone in direct physical contact with the infected person, someone who has shared eating or drinking utensils with an infected person, or someone who has been sneezed or coughed on by an infected person. An exception of a close contact in an indoor classroom is when (1) both individuals are engaged in consistent and correct use of well-fitted face masks and (2) school prevention strategies (correct use of mask, physical distancing, increased ventilation) are in place. Isolation for Students with Positive Covid-19 Test Students who test positive for Covid-19 or those who are symptomatic and choose not to test, will be required to isolate at home for 10 days from the onset of symptoms, and may return after the 10 days, if free of fever for 24 hours and symptoms have improved. School facilities have received a thorough cleaning in preparation of the return of teachers and students. High traffic areas and high touch areas in classrooms and facilities will be cleaned minimally twice during the school day. Crowds will be minimized at entry ways. An isolation area will be designated at each school site for students who are ill. Each school will be assigned a school nurse. Contact tracing will continue at each school.
Transportation	 School Buses Masks are required for all students and adults while traveling on a school bus. This includes traveling to and from school, athletic events, etc. All students must be wearing masks when getting on the bus and keep them on until they exit the bus. School buses will be disinfected regularly and scheduled cleaning protocols will be in place. Seating charts will be maintained by bus operators to aid in contact tracing as needed. Windows will remain down unless it presents as a safety or health hazard.
Hygienic Supplies	School employees should be provided adequate access to hygienic supplies, including soap, hand sanitizer with at least 60 percent alcohol, paper towels, and disinfectant spray as needed. Face coverings should also be provided when needed.
Student Programming Determinations	 Instruction will be in-person unless a student meets criteria for temporary homebound services. For more information on homebound services or to request an application, you may contact Lisa Bastion, Chief Pandemic Officer at 318-255-1430, or by email at lbastion@lincolnschools.org. (Medical documentation is required and must accompany application.) Student placement determinations are based on in person instruction or homebound services. Student placement determinations should take into the medical needs of a student, as identified by the parent or guardian and the student's physician.
Visitors to School Facilities	All visitors will wear masks while on campus, and only essential visitors should be permitted on campus. Essential visitors are defined as being on campus to conduct observations, interventions,

	in-district special education services, in-district mental health consultations, etc.
Miscellaneous for Students	 Masks are required for all students in grades K-12 Students will be required to wash hands and sanitize often during the day. Social distancing to the greatest extent possible is recommended. No masks are recommended when students are outside. Mask breaks are recommended throughout the day at the teacher's discretion. Students should bring a water bottle with water to drink during the day. Water fountains will be open to refill students' water bottles. However, students may not drink from the spout. Students will be responsible for missed work when absent, quarantined due to exposure, or isolating to testing positive, and should access their teachers' Google Classrooms for information.
