Check Out What's Happening at Morse School: Week of 4/24



This week we reviewed the four seasons. We also began talking about the types of weather and how weather affects us. On Thursday afternoon, we even got to experience three types of weather during our recess - sun, then rain, then some surprise hail at the end of our recess! It was very exciting!

1	We had a great week back from vacation! To start our week we had a special musician guest, Lisa Cooley, who taught us some new songs and we used the rhythm sticks. Our field trip to YMCA was different than planned, since we were unable to use the pool but we still had a fun time. We got to play in the gym with first graders from Monroe. We began to learn about the water cycle in science and learned a new song: The Water Cycle Hoe-Down!
2	This week in second grade we reviewed our Morse ROARS and spent time reflecting on our behaviors. We have began earning extra recess on Friday afternoons for listening to the teacher, completing classwork, keeping our work space clean, and being respectful. We continue to work on two digit addition and two digit subtraction. Students are also learning about different characteristics for mammals, birds, amphibians, arthropods, and archinids. Hopefully this week won't be as rainy and outside recess can happen more. We could use more tissues in second grade please.
4	We participated in community service with fifth grade this week. Students worked together to help clean up trash on the roads near school. We had beautiful weather for a walk on Friday, and it was great to see teamwork from all the students!
5	This week 5th graders participated in some community service with our 4th grade friends. We were able to pick up 2 full bags of garbage and debris just from our own street! Thank you, Linda Lord, for inviting us to participate! We are gearing up for our end of year assessments. Attendance is very important for these next few weeks in order for everyone to get the same information at the same time. We are also earning coins for attendance for some fun, end of year activities.
SEL	This week at Morse, 4 and 5 finished and presented their class projects. 2-3 learned about S.T.E.P. to solve problems.
Garden	Did you know that a honeybee only produces 1/12 tsp. of honey in its lifetime?! They also flap their wings 200 times in a second!! We learned these, and other amazing facts, about the life of a honeybee. Thanks to Maine Agriculture in the Classroom, all classes received the award-winning book, Honeybee: The Busy Life of Apis Mellifera. If you have an agricultural license plate, thank you! Part of the funds from this plate support this fantastic program.
