K/1	What a hot and busy week! We have finally wrapped up end of the year testing, and I am so proud of how hard everyone has worked to show what they know and of all the growth that was made this year. We are finishing up a couple of science mini-units. This week we started learning about the water cycle including making a "cloud in a box" and monitoring how fast water evaporates. Next week, we'll revisit the five senses.
1	We checked our knowledge on plural nouns with a scavenger hunt for words in the classroom and hallway that we had to add s or es to. Then we checked our answers using a QR reader on the iPads. During our workshop rotations this week, students had the opportunity to look at different seeds with magnifying glasses and write/draw about them, read books about plants, made a plant life cycle diagram and labeled stages, and best of all, got to do some dramatic play in the class Flower Shop. In math we were comparing numbers up to 120 with greater than, less than, or equal to signs.
4	We're strengthening our writing skills by completing some fun end-of-year writing activities. We're continuing to work on multiplication fluency in order to divide more fluently. We've also had time to celebrate progress in our classroom! I'm proud of everyone's hard work!
5	Please join our class on Friday, June 9th to help us celebrate our 5th graders as they move onto middle school. Our class will walk to the park around 12:30 where we will meet friends and family for lunch. After that, the kids would like to challenge the adults to a game of kickball. We will wrap up the afternoon inside the community building, there at the park, for the presentation of certificates. I'm looking forward to a fun afternoon to celebrate all that the 5th graders have accomplished during their time at Morse Memorial. Permission slips for our walk to the park have already been sent home. Because we have access to the building, we will do this on the 9th, rain or shine. We hope to see you all there!
