<p>K-2</p>	<p>Thursday we had Read Across America. Students wore red, white, and blue. We had a camping theme in the classrooms. Students got to read under tents with their flashlights. They also got to buddy read with the 3-5 students.</p>
<p>3-5</p>	<p>Reading: This week was Read Across America Day!! We spent Thursday afternoon and Friday reading 16 different books to choose which one was the best book! It was in the form of March Madness brackets. Ask us about it! We also started Bikes for Books! You should have seen a letter that came home with your child about it.</p> <p>Math: We started diving into division! We explored some strategies and definitions to use through this unit.</p> <p>Science: We learned about the movement of moons and planets this week. Ask your child to demonstrate rotation and revolution!</p>
<p>SEL</p>	<p>This week 3-5 got into groups for an upcoming project. They brainstormed some challenges that arise in group projects and are thinking of some problem solving skills. K-2 is starting a new book with fun activities, about kindness, goals, working hard, and not giving up.</p>
<p>Garden</p> 	<p>What an exciting week! We tapped maple trees! We put in six taps on maples around our school yard. The sap will be collected daily by the students, and in a couple of weeks, we will boil it down outside at school! If you have any dry wood you'd like to donate, we'll be collecting it near the shed by the dumpster. Thanks so much!</p>
