K-2	<p>Reading: This week in 1&amp;2 we started working on reading and spelling words that contain long vowels.</p> <p>Math: Both 1&amp;2 graders have been diving into learning about money. We have been practicing skip counting the different types of coins and identifying them by their name. If you have some change at home you might consider practicing with your child.</p> <p>Social Studies: This week we worked more on cardinal directions. Students used a map and tried to navigate where certain items were on a campground.</p>
