## Health and Safety Plan for Appalachia Intermediate Unit 8

Appalachia Intermediate Unit 8 (IU8) Health and Safety Plan serves as our organization's guidelines for continuity of operations and educational service and programming. The development of the Health and Safety Plan is informed by the guidance provided by the Pennsylvania Department of Education (PDE), the Office of Child Development and Early Learning (OCDEL), the Pennsylvania Department of Health (PA-DOH), the Center for Disease Control (CDC). The IU8 Health and Safety Plan takes into consideration that transmission levels do not always occur in a linear path. Instead, cycling back and forth between less restrictive to more restrictive designations based on public health indicators.

The IU8 Pandemic Team continues to serve as developers of the plan and as members of the Pandemic Response Team for our organization. The members of this team provide for a span of control for the Health and Safety Plan across general operations of our IU, and programs and services, as well as positions our IU to be responsive at all levels and to work together more effectively and efficiently no matter the case, size, or complexity of the planning and implementation of operations, logistics and resource management, finances, supporting technologies, communications, and professional learning needs.

## Identify Type of Reopening

High, Substantial, Moderate, and Low Levels of Community Transmission are fluid data points that are important influencers to local and regional planning: Educational Entities, including Intermediate Units and School Districts, continue to have an emergency instructional plan option to navigate local needs considering current conditions and circumstances, as they apply to the specific classroom, building, or school district.

The instructional models school districts have available include in-person, hybrid/blended, or full-remote, with a clear message from both the federal and state education departments that full, in-person instruction to the maximum extent. Thus, instructional models may continue to fluctuate in response to health and safety considerations and Department of Health recommendations.

2021-2022 School Reopening: IU8 anticipates a total reopen for all students and staff with options for virtual teaching and learning based on the needs of our educational partners, as well as the learners we serve.

Our Pandemic Team formation and alignment positions IU 8 to execute and maintain a span of control for the IU8 Health & Safety Plan. This approach enables our organization to be nimble, standardized, and united in our efforts. This approach enables our organization to be responsive at all levels and to work together more effectively and efficiently to manage incidents no matter what the cause, size, or complexity. IU 8 uses the action levels of prevention, protection, mitigation, response, and recovery to guide the planning for IU 8's Phased Reopening Plan. In the development of our Health and Safety Plan, special consideration was given to the fluidity of coronavirus/emerging infectious diseases that we had experienced throughout the previous school year and thus learned how to best navigate the shifting transmission levels that varied across the four-county region that comprises IU8.

#### **Domain Summary: Social Distancing and Other Safety Protocols**

The Intermediate Unit is an educational service agency serving multiple counties and across a variety of educational settings, both school-based and community based. As such, IU8's Health and Safety (H&S) Plan will reflect areas and locations within and outside IU8's locus of control. For those areas within IU8's locus of control, we will follow the plans and protocols established by IU8's team and outlined across IU8's H&S Plan. For any location outside of IU8's locus of control, we will review the H&S plans developed by our collaborative partners and school districts and practice the health & safety as established, to the best of our ability.

All guidance for public schools has identified social distancing as a priority measure across all environments. As such, IU8 will honor the social distancing guidelines to the greatest extent that is possible, while also recognizing our responsibility to provide meaningful and necessary educational supports and services to all learners. IU8 will apply the action steps to social distance our learners, adjust our practices with any meals or snacks for our learners, prioritizing proper and frequent handwashing, and adjust our practices to significantly limit or prevent non-essential personnel and visitors to IU8 locations. The Social Distancing and Other Safety Protocols section of our plan outlines the specific steps IU8 has planned and will employ across various settings and locations. We will review, adjust and update this section as needed in response to changes in health and safety guidance for schools, as well as in response to our local needs.

- -Individuals who are communicating or seeking to communicate with someone with a hearing impairment or some other disability, where the ability to see the mouth is essential to communication, are not required to wear a mask and may use the clear shields with side/bottom fabric purchased by IU and available to staff, during service delivery. - -In all locations where an IU8 operated classroom is hosted by a school district, classrooms and IU8 personnel will continue to follow the health and safety practices established for all adults and students at the district and/or building location.
