Back to School Checklist

The first day of school is probably one of the most exciting times for children, renewing old friendships, meeting new friends, and working through the fray of new schedules, books, lockers and, in the case of children entering a building for the first time, unfamiliar floor plans, teachers, and administrators. Following are a few tips to "survive" the first few days of school. We hope this checklist is helpful.

- School begins for students in grades K-12 on September 7.
- School hours are as follows: **Middle School and High School** students enter building at 8:05 a.m.; 9th period ends at 2:34 p.m. first dismissal. Tenth period dismissal at 3:09 p.m. **Elementary Schools** students enter building at 8:55 a.m. Students are dismissed at 3:25 p.m. Please do not drop students off early; early morning supervision is limited, unless students are involved in the YMCA Program.
- Bus riders should note bus routes and approximate pick-up times, which are published in local papers. Additional transportation questions should be directed to the Transportation Office at 731-1732.
- We ask all children, but especially walkers, to be respectful of our neighbors' property. Please do not cut across lawns, through private property, etc.
- Are there legal agreements that affect your child? Custody agreements or limitations, orders of protection, name changes, etc. should be on file with the school office.
- Will your child need to take medication in school? Please consult the nurse in your respective building for medication guidelines and requirements.
 All medication to be taken in school must be first referred through the school nurse.
- Breakfast and lunches are free to all students. Additional ala carte items
 will be available to students to purchase. Students may bring their own
 lunch, but are encouraged to take advantage of the free meal program.
 Menus are distributed the first day of school and are also published on
 the district website at www.cacsd.org
- Free breakfast is served at school. School breakfast will give your child a healthy start to the day. Upon arrival, breakfast will be available for all students.



Coxsackie-Athens Central School District Code of Conduct Summary

All students have certain rights when attending our school. Among those are the right to a safe and orderly environment, equal access to all district activities and programs, and the right to due process in all matters regarding disciplinary sanctions. However, students also have responsibilities, which include contributing to that safe and orderly environment, following district rules and policies, maintaining regular attendance, working to the best of their ability, accepting responsibility for actions, dressing appropriately for school and school functions, and seeking help to resolve problems or issues that may lead to disciplinary consequences.

ESSENTIAL PARTNERS. Our educational program is dependent upon "Essential Partners," those individuals who contribute directly to a student's success. Each of those partners have specific responsibilities which, when met, will help to assure a successful educational experience. The partners include parents, teachers, guidance counselors, other school personnel, principals, the Superintendent, and the Board of Education. The comprehensive code spells out the specific expectations for each of the partners.

STUDENT DRESS CODE. Students dress is expected to be appropriate to the school setting. It should not be disruptive or distracting to the educational process. Extremely brief garments, including tube tops, halter tops, spaghetti straps, plunging necklines (front and back), and see-through garments are not acceptable. Similarly, undergarments should be completely covered by outer clothing. Footwear must also be worn at all times. Footwear that may be deemed a safety hazard will not be permitted.

Clothing that includes items that are vulgar, obscene, libelous, or which may denigrate others will not be permitted. Similarly, clothing which may promote or endorse the use of alcohol, tobacco, or illegal drugs or illegal or violent activity is not acceptable.

PROHIBITED STUDENT CONDUCT. The comprehensive code outlines, in detail, areas of prohibited student conduct. These include disorderly conduct, insubordination, disruptive behavior, violent conduct, or any other behavior which endangers the safety, morals, health, or welfare of others. Also prohibited is misconduct on a school bus as well as academic misconduct (e.g. plagiarism, cheating). The code also provides specific attention to incidents involving weapons, students who commit violent acts, and students who are repeatedly and substantially disruptive to the educational process. The code also acknowledges the specific due process and procedural safeguards afforded students with disabilities under the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA).

PENALTIES. When penalties are imposed, administrators must take into account various issues, which include the age of the student, the circumstances surrounding the offense, prior disciplinary record, information received from other sources, as well

as any extenuating circumstances. A range of penalties is provided, which may be imposed according to the nature and circumstance of the offense. The penalties include verbal warnings, counseling/mediation, detention, removal from class by a teacher, suspension from activities or privileges, placement in an alternative learning site, and out-of-school suspension. Referral to Family Court or other agencies may also be part of disciplinary action.

Teachers may remove a disruptive student from a class for a period of up to two days. Parent notification is a required part of this process, along with due process rights to discuss reasons for the removal.

PROGRESSIVE RESPONSE TO BEHAVIOR ISSUES. The Coxsackie-Athens Central School District also believes that discipline is best administered in a progressive fashion. Category I behavior (incidents of a relatively minor nature or first-time lower-level offenses) will be met with responses different from Category IV behavior (students who have committed acts of violence or who are repeatedly disruptive or substantially interfere with the teacher's authority over the classroom).

STUDENT SEARCHES AND INTERROGATIONS. In attempting to assure a safe and orderly environment, students may be questioned by school officials regarding alleged violations of law or the district Code of Conduct. Furthermore, searches of students and their belongings, according to specific guidelines, are also authorized where there is reasonable suspicion that the student violated the law or the district Code of Conduct or where safety may be threatened. Students have no reasonable expectation of privacy with respect to computer files, student lockers, desks, and other school storage places. These may be searched at any time without prior notice or consent. The Board of Education has also authorized the intermittent use of a drug-sniffing dog.

PUBLIC CONDUCT ON SCHOOL PROPERTY. All persons on school property or at school functions are expected to conduct themselves in a respectful and orderly manner. Specifically prohibited conduct includes intentional injury or threat; damaging school property; disruptive conduct; distributing or wearing materials or objects that are obscene, libelous, advocate illegal action or obstruct the rights of others; smoking or use of tobacco products on school property; possession, consumption, sale or distribution of alcoholic beverages or controlled substances or being under the influence of either; possession of weapons; loitering, or refusing to comply with any reasonable request of recognizable school officials while performing their duties. Conduct expectations for the public will be clearly posted in each building.

District Computer & Electronic Resources

As part of its educational programs, the Coxsackie-Athens Central School District makes computers, Internet access, and on-line interactive communications available to students. Although the use of these resources is a vital part of District educational programs, parents and their students should be aware that District computer privileges can be curtailed or suspended for violations of the policy and regulations governing use of District computer and Network Resources, a copy of which can be accessed on the district's website or is available through any school office.

In addition to the District's rules, computer use and Internet access are subject to local, state, federal and international laws, regulations and treaties. Students are expected to respect and adhere to those laws. Any attempt to violate or circumvent applicable laws when using District Computer and network Resources may result in either civil litigation or prosecution, by providing any relevant information within its possession.

The District makes reasonable efforts to secure its Computer System against unauthorized access or misuse. These efforts include monitoring student use of computers, and the installation, on district computer connected to the Internet, of software designed to block or filter access to visual depictions that are obscene, pornographic, or harmful to minors as defined by Federal law. However, it is impossible for the District to prevent access to all controversial materials, or to comply with specific parental demands concerning an individual student's use of the Internet and other Computer or Network Resources.

Parents are encouraged to monitor their children's use of District computers and computer accounts, and should report immediately any misuse, or access to inappropriate materials, which they or their children experience or detect.

Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA)

Notice for Directory Information

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA), a Federal law, requires that Coxsackie-Athens Central School District, with certain exceptions, obtain your written consent prior to the disclosure of personally identifiable information from your child's education records. However, Coxsackie-Athens Central School District may disclose appropriately designated "directory information" without written consent, unless you have advised the Coxsackie-Athens Central School District to the contrary in accordance with Coxsackie-Athens Central School District procedures. The primary purpose of directory information is to allow the Coxsackie-Athens Central School District to include information from your child's education records in certain school publications. Examples include:

- A playbill, showing your student's role in a drama production;
- The annual yearbook;
- Honor roll or other recognition lists;
- Graduation programs; and
- · Sports activity sheets, such as for wrestling, showing weight and height of team members.

Directory information, which is information that is generally not considered harmful or an invasion of privacy if released, can also be disclosed to outside organizations without a parent's prior written consent. Outside organizations include, but are not limited to, companies that manufacture class rings or publish yearbooks. In addition, two federal laws require local educational agencies (LEAs) receiving assistance under the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965, as amended (ESEA) to provide military recruiters, upon request, with the following information—names, addresses and telephone listings—unless parents have advised the LEA that

they do not want their student's information disclosed without their prior written consent. [Note: These laws are Section 9528 of the ESEA (20 U.S.C. § 7908) and 10 U.S.C. § 503(c).1

If you do not want Coxsackie-Athens Central School District to disclose any or all of the types of information designated below as directory information from your child's education records without your prior written consent, you must notify the Coxsackie-Athens Central School District in writing by September 1, 2020. The Coxsackie-Athens Central School District has designated the following information as directory information: [Note: an LEA may, but does not have to, include all the information listed below.]

- Student's name
- Address
- Telephone listing
- Electronic mail address
- Photograph
- Date and place of birth
- Major field of study
- Dates of attendance
- Grade level
- Participation in officially recognized activities
- Weight and height of members of athletic
- · Degrees, honors, and awards received
- The most recent educational agency or institution attended
- Student ID number, user ID, or other unique personal identifier used to communicate in electronic systems but only if the identifier cannot be used to gain access to education records except when used in conjunction with one or more factors that authenticate the user's identity, such as a PIN, password, or

- other factor known or possessed only by the authorized user
- A student ID number or other unique personal identifier that is displayed on a student ID badge, but only if the identifier cannot be used to gain access to education records except when used in conjunction with one or more factors that authenticate the user's identity, such as a PIN, password, or other factor known or possessed only by the authorized user.

Required Notification Regarding Pesticide Use

New York State Education Law Section 409-H, effective July 1, 2001, requires all public and nonpublic elementary and secondary schools to provide written notification to all persons in parental relation, faculty and staff regarding the potential use of pesticides periodically throughout the school year.

The Coxsackie-Athens Central School District is required to maintain a list of persons in parental relation, faculty and staff who wish to receive 48-hour prior written notification of certain pesticide applications. The following pesticide applications are not subject to prior notification requirements:

- A school remains unoccupied for a continuous 72 hours following application;
- Anti-microbial products;
- Nonvolatile insecticidal baits in tamper-resistant bait stations in areas inaccessible to children;
- Boric acid and disodium octaborate tetrahydrate;
- The application of EPA designated biopesticides;
- The application of EPA designated exempt materials under 40CFR152.25;
- The use of aerosol products with a directed spray in containers of 18 fluid ounces or less when used to protect individuals from an imminent threat from stinging and biting insects including venomous spiders, bees, wasps and hornets.

(Please note: The Coxsackie-Athens Central School District does not typically apply any pesticides that would require notification under this law.)

In the event of an emergency application necessary to protect against an imminent threat to human health, a good faith effort will be made to supply written notification to those on the 48-hour prior notification list.

Health and Wellness

The Coxsackie-Athens Central School District is committed to the optimal development of every student. The District believes that for students to have the opportunity to achieve personal, academic, developmental and social success, we need to create positive, safe and health-promoting learning environments at every level, in every setting, throughout the school year.

This policy outlines the District's approach to ensuring environments and opportunities for all students to practice healthy eating and physical activity behaviors throughout the school day while minimizing commercial distractions. Specifically, this policy establishes goals and procedures to ensure that:

- Students in the District have access to healthy foods throughout the school day—both through reimbursable school meals and other foods available throughout the school campus—in accordance with Federal and state nutrition standards;

- The community is engaged in supporting the work of the District in creating continuity between school and other settings for students and staff to practice lifelong healthy habits; and
- The District establishes and maintains an infrastructure for management, oversight, implementation, communication about and monitoring of the policy and its established goals and objectives.

Attendance Policy

Good attendance is critical to school achievement. Coxsackie-Athens Central School District reviews and updates its attendance policy yearly to assure it conforms with new state guidelines. Parents should note that student attendance appears on high school interim reports and report cards, as does middle and high school notification benchmarks, which result in letters being sent directly to them. The attendance policy is discussed with students during the first week of school and in student handbooks. Full copies of the policy are available on www.cacsd.org or from school offices.

Highlights

EXCUSED ABSENCES OR TARDINESS. Excused absences or tardiness must be documented in writing upon the child's return to school. When possible, parents should contact the school in writing or by telephone prior to the absence. Students must make up all work missed.

Excused absences include: personal illness, death in the family, medical appointments (that cannot be scheduled outside of school hours), court appearances/ legal obligations, religious observances, quarantine, approved educational program, approved cooperative work program, military obligations, pre-approved college visits for high school juniors and seniors, and other absences that may be excused at the discretion of the principal.

UNEXCUSED ABSENCES OR TARDINESS. An unexcused absence or tardy is for any reason not included above, absences not pre-approved by the district or absences for which an inappropriate note or documentation is submitted. Family trips or vacations during school time, haircuts, shopping or an absence without a specific reason are also considered unexcused absences, as are "oversleeping" going out to breakfast, or "car trouble." Students must make up all work missed.

TRUANCY. Absence for any reason whereby parents believe their child to be in school is considered truant, as is leaving school without permission. Make-up work will not be offered.

PENALTIES FOR POOR ATTENDANCE; PARENT NOTIFICATION. Chronic absences and tardiness, either excused or unexcused, is not tolerated. Make-up work is expected for excused and unexcused absences; it is not offered for truancy. Excessive absences or tardiness are addressed in the following manner.

Elementary School

- 10% of days absent = letter to parents
- 20 days absent or tardy = letter to parents advising that PINS (Person in Need of Supervision) petition may be filed or other intervention at the building principal's discretion may be sought
- 30 days absent or tardy = District attorney may be notified

Middle School

- 10% of days absent = letter to parents
- 20 days absent = letter to parents advising that PINS petition may be filed or building principal may seek other intervention
- 30 days absent = District Attorney may be notified
- Each truancy = student is assigned to an Alternate Learning Site; notice sent to parents

High School

- 10% of days absent = letter to parents
- 20 days absent = letter to parents advising that PINS petition may be filed or building principal may seek other intervention
- 30 days absent = District Attorney may be notified
- Attendance notification is made in five week intervals through interim progress reports and quarterly report cards. Parents should carefully note attendance information on report cards, which is a cumulative year-to-date total.
- At each interval, the building principal will review the number of absences.
 Excessive absences compel the district to file a PINS petition or invoke other intervention services.
- ° 3 unexcused tardies to a class = 1 unexcused absence to that class
- Any unexcused tardy in excess of 20 minutes constitutes an unexcused absence for that class
- Each truancy student is assigned to an Alternate Learning Site; notice sent to parents.

No Child Left Behind Act

As part of the Federal No Child Left Behind Act, parents of each student attending a Title I school may request information about the professional qualifications of their child's classroom teacher. The same information can be requested about a Teaching Assistant who is assigned to the child's classroom.

If a parent or guardian requests such information in writing, the district will respond to him/her in writing within ten (10) school days. The information will be provided in an understandable and uniform format.

The written response will include the following information:

- Whether the teacher has met State qualifications and licensing criteria for the grade levels and subject areas in which the teacher provides instruction;
- Whether the teacher is teaching under emergency or other provisional status through which State qualifications or licensing criteria have been waived;
- The baccalaureate degree major of the teacher and any other graduate certification or degree held by the teacher as well as the field of discipline of the certification or degree; and,
- Whether the child is provided services by teaching assistants and, if so, their qualifications.



Annual Notification Availability of Asbestos **Management Plan**

In compliance with the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act (AHERA), an asbestos re-inspection of asbestos containing building materials was performed for each school building.
