# **English Language Learners (ELL):**

### **Individuals with Disabilities Education Act**

Under the Individuals with Disabilities Act (IDEA), school districts must give parents of a child with disabilities a copy of procedural safeguards one year at a time. A copy of the procedural safeguards must also be given to parents upon initial referral or parental request for an evaluation, upon filing a request for a due process hearing, and upon request of a parent.

## **Opt Out Form for District School Students**

**Directory Information:** The district may disclose information that is generally not considered harmful or an invasion of privacy if the primary purpose is to allow the district to include this type of information in certain school publications, such as yearbooks, newsletters, playbills, honor rolls, web page, social media, school announcements, local news/media outlets, or military. Directory information includes the student's name, address, email address and telephone number; the parents' names, addresses and telephone numbers; the student's photograph; date and place of birth; class /grade level; enrollment dates; weight and height if the student is a member of an athletic team; awards received; and extracurricular participation.

The district will not disclose directory information unless the district or school will use the information in a publication or a third party has requested the information for a reason that, in the judgement of the district, serves the student's best interests. For example, the district will comply with directory information requests from another school in which a student seeks to enroll, universities and colleges, law enforcement and Child Protective Services. The district will provide directory information for commercial purposes only if beneficial to students, such as yearbook or class ring sales. Your child's directory information will be released as described above, unless you direct otherwise by checking the box below:

**HELP WANTED!** The Nutrition Services Department is currently looking for part-time kitchen helpers/cashiers, a food truck delivery driver and substitutes. USDA has passed a waiver for ALL students to receive free breakfast and lunch for the 2021-22 school year. However, it is still very important to fill out the application for the new school year in the event P-EBT benefits are distributed once again. IF YOU ARE NOT APPROVED FOR FREE OR REDUCED PRICED MEALS FOR THE 2021-22 SCHOOL YEAR, YOU WILL NOT BE ELIGIBLE FOR P-EBT BENEFITS FOR THE NEW SCHOOL YEAR. Please fill out an application to avoid missing out if these benefits are offered.

FREE & REDUCED MEAL APPLICATIONS: Packets will be mailed out in mid to late August to all households that do not receive a pre-approval letter for free or reduced price meals. If you receive a letter from us approving your student for free or reduced price meals for the 2021-22 school year prior to the start of school, you do not need to apply. Only one application is necessary as long as all students are listed on the application along with the schools they will attend in our district. All prior year applications will expire on October 1st, 2021. If you do not fill out a new application by that date, your student will no longer be reported as free or reduced in our system, unless you submit a new application for this school year. Completed applications may be returned to the school office, the lunch room cashier or mailed to the Nutrition Services Office at P.O. Box 6278, Saginaw, MI 48608. Incomplete and/or unsigned applications will be returned. You will receive a letter notifying you as to whether your application is approved free, reduced or denied, along with the reason for denial, within 2 weeks from the date the application is received. If you need assistance with the application, contact the Nutrition Services Office at 989-793-9713.

**ONLINE APPLICATION:** An online version of the application is available by logging into your student's school meal account. (Online

instructions are located on the Nutrition Services website at: www.stcs.org, Departments, Nutrition Services.) If you do not have access to a computer, please fill out the free and reduced price school meal paper application for your family.

PLEASE APPLY Your student's eligibility for free or reduced price meals also provides the District with much needed funding for instructional and pupil support services. If you are not sure whether your children qualify or whether your children will use the meal program, please apply for free or reduced price meals anyway. Your information is completely confidential and will not be shared without your permission. Every student's eligibility equates to additional funding for the District! In addition, as mentioned above, if the State decides to continue P-EBT benefits, you will not be eligible in this district unless you have a current year approved free or reduced application on file or received a direct certification free letter from us.

MEAL PRICES: The USDA has passed a waiver for the 2021-22 school year allowing all students one free breakfast and lunch per school day, regardless of meal application status. This includes the breakfast and lunch provided as a "full meal" including milk which meets the USDA required guidelines. This does not apply to "al a carte" or extra items available for students to purchase at the middle and high school level. It also does not apply to just milk purchases for children bringing a cold lunch. The cost of a carton of milk is .60 per carton. The State considers just milk as an a la carte purchase and will not reimburse it as free. Breakfast and lunch menus will be posted on the STCS website under the Nutrition Services link prior to the start of school.

PAY ONLINE: If your child will be bringing cold lunch and will want to purchase milk at the elementary buildings you may want to put some money on their account. All breakfasts and lunches at the elementary will be free, so there is no need to add money to their account if they will be taking the full meal. The high school and middle school level will offer additional options to purchase beyond the free meals and we call these "a la carte" items. Students will not be allowed to "charge" a la carte items, they will need money in their debit account, or cash to

purchase these. All enrolled students have a debit account on our point of sale system. All students use an ID card or enter their ID number on a PIN pad when going through the lunch line. You may deposit money into your student's account online with a credit or debit card (includes a \$2.00 convenience fee) or by sending cash or a check to school with your student. The money may be used to purchase milk or, at the middle and high schools, ala carte items. Any balance remaining at the end of the school year automatically carries over to the next year. Online access to your student's account information is available by completing the online access request form at www.stcs.org, Departments, Nutrition Services, Online Access Request (under links).

BREAKFAST IS SERVED AT SCHOOL: School breakfast will give your child a healthy start to the day. A nutritious breakfast helps students be more alert so they can learn more in class. Breakfast has vitamins and nutrients for a strong and healthy body, and this year it is free!

**SPECIAL DIETARY NEEDS:** If your child has a special dietary need as determined by a physician, we will do our best to make reasonable accommodations. The State of Michigan does require a signed form from your child's physician stating the prescribed diet and/or substitution. This form can be accessed on the Nutrition Services web page at www.stcs.org, Departments, Nutrition Services, Special Dietary Restrictions & Needs, and must be on file in the Nutrition Services Office.

We are very proud of the service provided by our department. We offer healthy food choices that meet the USDA's nutritional guidelines for school meals while still making the meals appealing to our students. We offer 1% white and chocolate milk. A variety of fruits, vegetables and whole grain items are served every day. All ala carte and snack items sold to students during the school day meet the USDA "Smart Snacks" guidelines. We are always looking for ways to improve our programs. We look forward to serving your children during the 2021-2022 school year. USDA is an equal opportunity provider and employer.

# AHERA NOTIFICATION

The Swan Valley School District is required by 40 CFR 763.80 to notify all parents, guardians, students and staff of the availability of the Asbestos Hazard Emergency Respones Act (AHERA) plan.

Our buildings were first inspected in 1988, and the last three year re-inspection was completed in July 2018.

# **Swan Valley School District NOTICE OF PESTICIDE USE**

Pesticides are periodically applied to school district property as part of the district's pest management program. Parents and legal guardians of children enrolled in the district have the right to request prior notification of pesticide applications to the buildings or grounds.

In order to be notified prior to the application of pesticides, the parent or legal guardian must request and return a "Pesticide Prior Notification Request Form." The form may be obtained from:


Please understand that emergencies do arise and that pesticides may be applied without prior notice to parents or legal guardians. Parents or legal guardians that have requested prior notification, however, will be notified after pesticide application.

Application of pesticides will be performed only by certified or registered applicators where and when required. If a pesticide is applied in a building, students will not occupy the room for a minimum of four hours. At the time of application, a sign will be posted for 48 hours near the building's primary point of entry. When a pesticide is applied to school district ground, the application will not be made within 100 feet of occupied classrooms, and flags will be inserted in the ground to mark the application area.

**Swan Valley Adult & Alternative Education** provides a blended and online learning opportunity. For the 2021-2022 school year, all students will work virtually and in person by using online curriculum. Classes are set in a Virtual Classroom provided by Zoom Monday through Thursday from 12:20-2:25pm and then in the building classroom from 3:00pm to 7:00pm and independently on Friday. All classes are self-paced per semester. Alternative students are age 16-21 and Adult students are 22 and older. Free and reduced lunch is available in our evening program. 
