IMPORTANT-QUARTER FOUR CHANGES TO HYBRID AND BRICK-TO-CLICK

We are planning for a fuller return of students to campus beginning quarter four. The exact number of days and/or length of the school day has not been determined, but Hybrid students will be on campus more days than the current Monday/Wednesday and Tuesday/Thursday Hybrid schedule.

In order to better prepare for this transition, I am asking parents to let me know if they are planning on staying in Hybrid, moving to Hybrid, moving to Brick-to-Click or staying in Brick-to-Click for the fourth quarter.

Please indicate the option you are **MOST LIKELY** to choose. **THIS IS NOT A COMMITMENT FORM**. We will be asking for a commitment in the future, but the purpose of this survey is to gather information.

If you choose Hybrid for quarter four:

- The number of days on campus will likely increase to at least four days a week.
- Cohort class sizes will increase and may be near 25 depending on the number of BTC students.
- If you choose Hybrid, students may move to BTC during the quarter but then must remain in BTC for the quarter. Transition back to Hybrid may be possible if space is available.

If you choose Brick-to-Click for guarter four:

- BTC students will no longer have a live, synchronous schedule. They will be asynchronous Monday through Friday.
- Teachers will be teaching larger numbers of Hybrid students and will not be available to respond to BTC students during the instructional period. An allotted time will be scheduled for BTC students to connect with their teachers.
- If you choose Brick-to-Click, students must remain in BTC for the quarter. Transition to Hybrid may be possible if space is available.

SPECIAL EDUCATION RECORDS DESTRUCTION


The Vail School District Special Education Office is in the process of destroying **Special Education** records for students who withdrew, transferred or graduated from high school four or more years ago. We are required to notify parents or students, if they are 18 years or older, to give them an opportunity to review the records before they are destroyed. Otherwise, records are due to be destroyed on June 1, 2021.

Seeing slowdown recently on your student's computer? Our staff has noticed it too.

Without getting too technical, many of the Chromebooks that are experiencing this slowdown are upwards of 8 years old. Google no longer supports these devices which in turn, removes the ability to update the ChromeOS.
