

What Is SSP?

“Student Success Planning” (SSP) is our school’s advisory program.

All students are assigned an SSP advisor, who also serves as their homeroom teacher.

SSP groups are purposefully created, based on a survey students take at the end of 8th grade.

SSP groups stay the same for all four years.

SSP meets during the lunch period on E days about once per month.

Each Grade Level has a specific focus:

- 9th Grade: Transitioning to high school, teambuilding, coming together as a group.
- 10th Grade: Becoming a self-reflective learning (understanding one’s strengths and self-advocating when needed)
- 11th Grade: Post-secondary planning (college and career exploration)
- 12th Grade: Capstone Project

Did You Know...

The Capstone Project:

- The Capstone Project is a one-credit graduation requirement.
