Sequence- Unit Titles and Number of weeks per unit (total = 18 semester/ 36 year)

- **Unit 1:** <u>SCIENTIFIC FOUNDATIONS OF PSYCHOLOGY</u> (2.5 weeks) Psychology is the scientific study of behavior and mental processes. Students will learn about the basis of psychological theory as the study of human and animal behavior and mental processes and learn how psychologists design and conduct research.
- **Unit 2:** <u>BIOLOGICAL BASES OF BEHAVIOR</u> (3 weeks) The structures of human biological systems and their functions influence our behavior and mental processes. Students will study behaviors and mental processes from a biological perspective and explore the effects of the interaction between human biology and our environment.
- **Unit 3:** <u>COGNITIVE PSYCHOLOGY</u> (3 weeks) Cognitive psychologists focus their research on the complex nature of the brain, particularly the areas of memory processes and the influences of mental processes on behavior. Students will examine the complex nature of how memory, intelligence, and other mental processes impact human behavior.
- **Unit 4:** <u>SENSATION AND PERCEPTION</u> (3 weeks) Psychologists study sensation and perception to explain how and why externally gathered sensations and perceptions impact behaviors and mental processes. Students will examine how humans perceive and process the world around them via their senses and convert those observations into perceptions that influence how we think and behave.
- **Unit 5:** <u>LEARNING</u> (2 weeks) Some psychologists focus on how humans and other animals learn and how some experiences can lead to changes in behavior and mental processes. Students will learn about the field of psychology that studies how humans and other animals learn as well as how learning changes over a lifetime.
- **Unit 6:** <u>DEVELOPMENTAL PSYCHOLOGY</u> (3.5 weeks) Developmental psychology encompasses the study of the behavior of organisms from conception to death. Students will study how physical and social changes over humans' lifespans can influence behavior and mental processes from a variety of perspectives.
- **Unit 7:** <u>PERSONALITY</u> (3 weeks) Psychologists use theory to categorize and explain different personalities. Students will study personality through the lens of behavior and mental processes and how they interact to produce an individual's

personality.

Unit 8: <u>CLINICAL PSYCHOLOGY</u> (4 weeks) - Psychologists will utilize a particular theoretical perspective to study and treat psychological disorders. Students will learn how psychologists evaluate, study, and treat a range of psychological disorders.

Unit 9: <u>SOCIAL PSYCHOLOGY</u> (3 weeks) - Psychological concepts and theoretical perspectives are pulled together from the course. Students will examine how humans interact in groups and social situations, as well as how others can affect an individual's behavior and mental processes.

Unit 10: <u>APPLICATIONS OF PSYCHOLOGY TODAY</u> (6 weeks) - Following the AP Test, the class will conduct a survey of how psychology is intertwined in every facet of our lives. Students will examine a host of topics including, but not limited to, Crime, Relationships, Media, and Social Status.

Big Ideas/Enduring Understanding (link to guide)

- Psychology examines human behavior and the mental processes through many different theories.
- Due to the nature of studying human behavior and the mind, psychologists must follow defined ethical standards and research methodology to ensure reliability and validity of their theories.
- Research and testing are essential in providing validity to psychological theories.
- Psychologists must understand the basics of neural science in order to develop valid theories about how our environment affects our behavior and mental processes.
- Each stage of consciousness is important to our biological and psychological development.
- Altered states of consciousness can have a positive and adverse effect on our biological and psychological development.
- The human ability to biologically adapt to our ever-changing environment allows our species to develop, thrive, and cope through social interactions with others.
- How human beings grow and develop physically and psychologically help in studying and understanding human behavior.
- The environment influences our personality development and affects our behavior and interactions with others.
- Due to the intricate nature of the human mind, disorders may occur that must be studied to improve our understanding of psychology.
