

STAUNTON CUSD #6 - FULL REMOTE LEARNING PLAN

**Please note that this document is subject to change at discretion of School Administration and the Staunton Board of Education.*

The Staunton School District has developed a Full Remote Learning Plan to address the following:

- A) Accessibility of the remote instruction to all students enrolled in the district
- B) When applicable, a requirement that the Remote Learning Day activities reflect the Illinois Learning Standards;
- C) Means for students to confer with an educator, as necessary;
- D) The unique needs of students in special populations, including, but not limited to, students eligible for special education; students who are English Learners; students experiencing homelessness under the Education for Homeless Children Act; or vulnerable student populations;
- E) How the district will take attendance and monitor and verify each student's remote participation

DISTRICT WIDE LEARNING PLATFORM = SCHOOLGY

Staunton CUSD No. 6 will utilize Schoology as the main learning platform for remote learning. The most up to date attendance and grade records will be found on Skyward. Teachers will also continue to utilize school issued Google Email, Zoom, Google Meets, Skyward, IXL and other software as needed.

STAUNTON CUSD #6 DAILY REMOTE LEARNING EXPECTATIONS

- Students must login to Schoology daily, participate as requested and complete work as assigned.
- It is expected that students participate in daily instruction as directed by their classroom teacher. This participation may come in the form of logging into Conferences, Google Meets, Zoom, paper packets, or another strategy as directed by the teacher. For example, if a student has class from 8:30 to 9:00, that student is to be logged in and participating from 8:30 to 9:00.
- Teachers will take attendance daily. Attendance will be based on students participating in the assigned activities via Conferences, Zoom, Google Meets or as directed by the classroom teacher.
- Remote Learning Teachers will make contact with their students daily via Schoology, Zoom, Google Meets, school issued Gmail, Conferences, paper-packets, or in-person sessions for select students.
 - Teacher will keep a communication log of student contact
- Options for students without reliable Internet access
 - Teachers will print paper packets and have them available.
 - The Community Room and School Library will be open from 8:30 AM to 12:48 PM.
 - Parents/Guardians may contact Madison Communications or another Internet provider and potentially receive free or reduced Internet access through the FCC Emergency Broadband Benefit Program. COMMUNICATION

Teachers will communicate with their students daily using Schoology, Gmail, and other forms as necessary.

In the event we are Full Remote Learning, it is understood that teachers are posting information in Schoology daily and parents will have access to the account.

TECHNOLOGY

See the one-to-one digital citizenship agreement and FAQ document located on the district website. All district staff will utilize Schoology as the main learning platform while supplementing with software such as Schoology, IXL, MAP, etc. While remote learning, Staunton CUSD #6 students will utilize the school issued Chromebook or iPad.

GRADING

Staunton CUSD #6 will use a traditional grading system to measure student learning during remote learning. Students will be held accountable. Students can and will fail a class and/or grade if their grades do not meet state requirements to pass.

STUDENT ATTENDANCE

Daily attendance will be taken based upon student participation and work completion.

Student attendance is critical to the learning process. Truancy is therefore a serious issue and will be dealt with in a serious manner by the school and district. Students who miss 5% or more of the prior 180 regular school days without valid cause (a recognized excuse) are considered chronic truants. A parent or guardian who knowingly and willfully permits a child to be truant is in violation of State law. If chronic truancy persists after support services and other resources are made available, the school and district will take further action, including:

- Appropriate school discipline
- Referral to the truancy officer
- Reporting to officials under the Juvenile Court Act
- Referral to the State's Attorney

Staunton CUSD #6 participates in the Macoupin County Truancy Program.

FOOD SERVICE FOR FULL REMOTE LEARNERS

During our Full Remote learning days, SCUSD No. 6 will provide breakfast and lunch for Staunton School District students. Meals will be available for pick up at Staunton Schools. Further information about meal sign up and pick up will be released once the school district enters a full remote learning phase.
